Alter The 1st? Throughout the United States many citizens have desired to educate their own children. In most every case when they carried the matter up to the state courts they were denied this inalienable

It has always been a mystery to me how the Supreme Court ever ruled that the parents did not have the right to educate their children. Remember, the First Amendment to the Constitution reads: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of

But you will note that it says "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of re-." and nothing about the states having the right to make laws permitting religion to be taught in schools.

In order to understand this Amendment, religion should be defined. There are probably about as many ideas of religion as there are i dividuals.

Of course, there would be no

question about the meaning of this admendment if the state limited itself only to protecting men's life and property as it should, rather than going into the welfare state business. When the state attempts to educate, it invariably attempts to promote and enlarge the power of the state rather than protect the rights of the individual to worship God and serve mankind as his con-

Now I read that it is a clause the Fourteenth Amendment that seems to take away from the states the right to regulate their own affairs as far as religion is concerned. The only thing I can find in the Fourteenth Amendment that might lead to any such conclusion is this state-

"No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection

of the laws." It is indeed difficult for me to see how that clause in the Fourteenth Amendment gives the U.S. Supreme Court the right to interfere with states' laws pertaining

This needlessly complex product could not possibly have had a beneficial effect on the young mother's cough, even if there were some good and sufficient reason for suppressing the cough. And the irritation produced by the 200 cigarettes, purchased at the same time, exceeded by far any soothing effect that might

have been produced by a gallon of the cough mixture. The cash register showed that the self-medicator had spent almost four dollars. A little more than one dollar was wasted on a useless cough mixture. A little more than two and a half dollars had been invested in a cough




