Screw Worm Eradication Not Practical, Ag Men Declare

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Agriculture Department said today it would not be practical at present to launch an all-out eradication campaign against the screw-worm in the southwestern U. S. and neighboring areas of Mexico. The problem of controlling or eradicating the screw-worm in that area "requires further research and field trial," the department said.

Strike Sets Rocket Work Off Schedule

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (UPI)—Space Chief T. Keith Glennan said today that the steel strike has set back work on a rocket with which the United States hopes to match some of Russia's early space feats. He referred to the Vega, a three-stage rocket based on the Atlas missile which he said will be able to put 4,800 pounds into orbit or send 1,000 pounds deep into space beyond the moon.

Fanatic Crucified By Friends

FRANKFURT, Germany (UPI)—Police said today an investigation has shown that Georg Krausert, a 65-year-old shoemaker and religious fanatic, hanged himself and friends crucified his body. A police spokesman said their nearly-completed investigation indicated no one would be charged with murder although some charge would be lodged against the persons who nailed the body to the wall and floor.

Zeckendorf Owns Tallest Buildings

NEW YORK (UPI)—Sold for the auctioneer's final cry \$18,150,000.
The skyscraper went on the auction block Tuesday with a required starting bid of 17 million dollars.

Only two prospective buyers stepped forward to deposit \$200,000 to enable them to enter the bidding. Zeckendorf, president of Webb & Knapp, Inc., and Sidney R. Nussenfeld, an attorney representing a syndicate of real estate investors, began the bidding briskly with \$25,000 jumps.

But at \$17,175,000 the offerings began to drop to \$1,000 and \$5,000 bids and both men cautiously felt their way into the higher brackets.
Zeckendorf began to put the pressure on at \$17,850,000 with jumps of \$49,000. Nussenfeld kept in the running with \$1,000 bids. At \$18,150,000, Nussenfeld said his group would have no other bid and the building was sold to Zeckendorf for that price.
Zeckendorf also owns the 77-story Chrysler Building, second tallest skyscraper in the world. The Empire State Building, which has 102 stories, is the tallest in the world.

NEW YORK (UPI) — The Metropolitan Opera opened its diamond season Monday night with the new production of "Il Trovatore" that had competition from the mutual attraction society in the bar. The evening was saved from obscurity by the met debut of Italian Mezzo Giulietta Bonato, moments of inspired singing by Antonietta Stella, Carlo Bonini and Leonard Warren, some of the loveliest voices ever designed for the house. Simonato lived up to her reputation as a rich-voiced soprano, but her dramatic intensity in the role of Gypsy Azucena fell short of Chloë Elmo, another great diva who sang at the Met decade ago. Simonato got her share of bravas even if soprano she got all the roses.

Protege Of Flynn Enters Estate Race

NEW YORK (UPI) — Beverly Aadland, the late Errol Flynn's 17-year-old traveling companion, has become one of the contestants for his estate with the possibility of receiving a one-third share.

Flynn's attorney, Justin Goldenblock, Monday filed a handwritten, unsigned will which named Miss Aadland. She was not named in a fully executed will made in 1954 which left bequests to Flynn's children and parents with the bulk going to his third wife, Patrice Wynmore.

Beverly said Flynn had dictated the will and she had written it down in a Havana hotel room last December when Flynn was leaving to join the Castro forces in the Cuban revolution.

She said Flynn had signed, and couldn't understand why the one filed Monday had no signature.

The will said Beverly "has been a true, loyal associate and greatly held in my esteem." It was not clear what one-third Beverly was supposed to inherit, as the will mentions she should get one-third of "my estate in Jamaica" and another section says "one-third of the Errol Flynn estates."

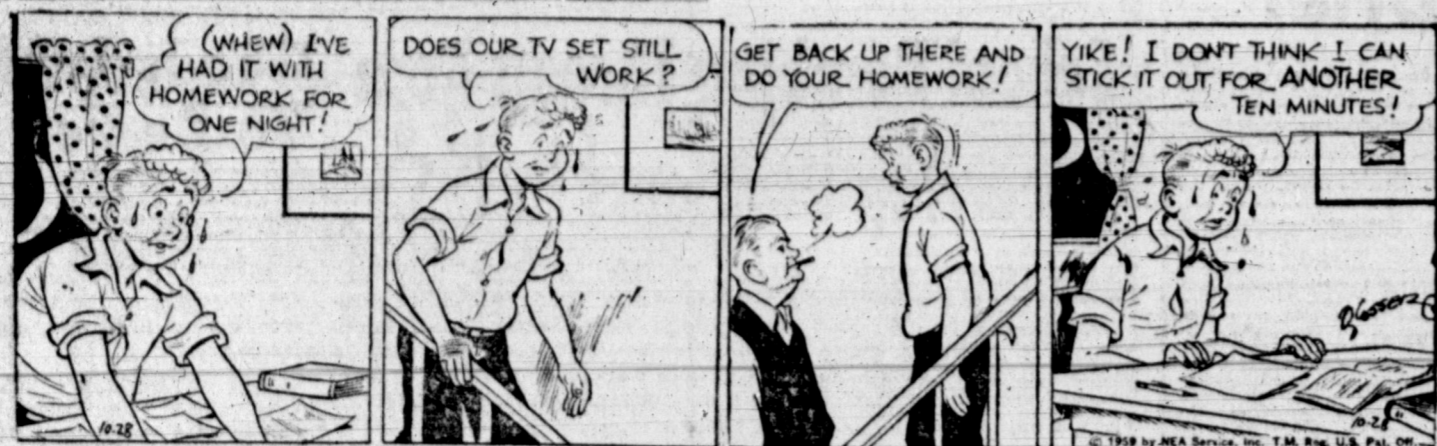

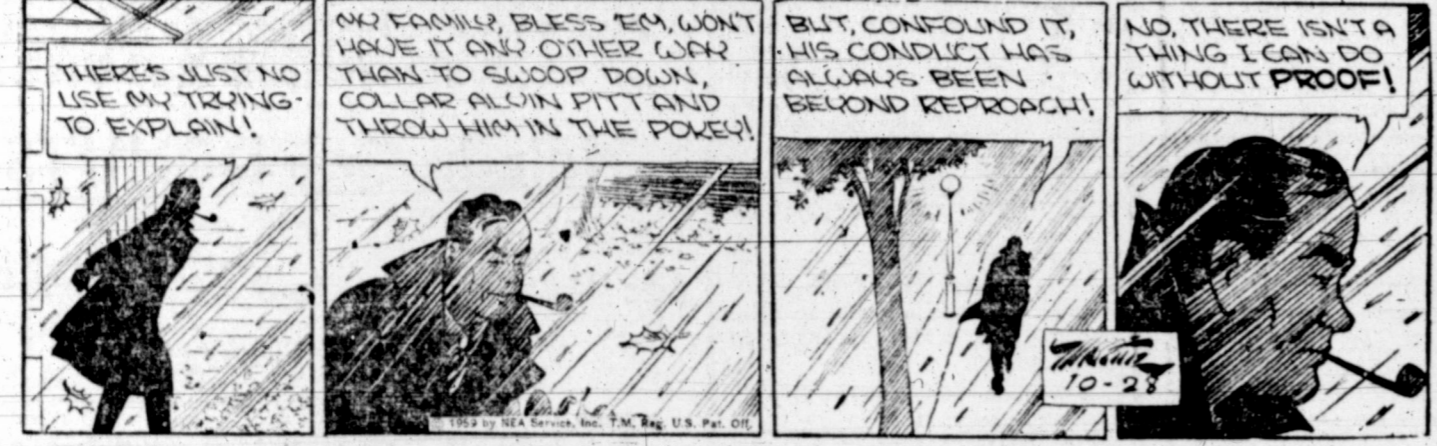

Four-Year-Old Viet Nam Celebrates Independence Day

Another new nation born of blood and delivered by compromise celebrated an anniversary Oct. 26.

The Republic of Viet Nam, one part of the three Indochina associated states of Viet Nam, Laos and Cambodia tied together after World War II of the numberless targets of Communist conquest.

A parade of weapons, most of them U.S.-supplied, marked the day in Saigon where on Oct. 26, interim premier Ngo Dinh Diem proclaimed the republic and named himself president.

From the end of 1958, the United States had poured nearly one billion dollars into the republic of Viet Nam. It is primarily responsible for training its army and through the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO), is responsible for its defense.

It is a neighbor of Communist-ruled Laos and along with Cambodia, is the strategic key to Southeast Asia. Under Communist domination, it could threaten Burma, Thailand, Singapore, Malaya and all the nations beyond, including the Philippines and Indonesia.

The republic of Viet Nam, long a history but with only a background of independence, emerged from the Geneva conference of 1954 which ended a nine-year fight by the French against Communist forces led by Ho Chi Minh, a revolutionary who once led in Paris and received his training in Moscow.

The 1954 conference carved Viet Nam into two zones at the 17th parallel. The northern half went to Communist control and the southern half, with a population of some 10 million, to forces friendly to the West.

By the war's end, it had cost a billion dollars, including two million in U.S. aid and more than 3,000 casualties. One year after Geneva, Ngo Dinh Diem proclaimed the southern zone's independence.

The worst is over now but few Vietnamese care to venture out at night because of the terror which stalks the little nation. Communist Viet Minh guerrillas fill room parts of the countryside. Diehard remnants of warlike religious sects still refuse to recognize the new government. Bandits are plentiful.

The republic of Viet Nam's problems closely paralleled those of Korea, also divided between Communists and non-Communists. The Communists in the north control mines, raw materials and industries, but are short on arable land. The anti-Communists control a rich agricultural area but have little in the way of resources and power.

From the beginning the south faced an enormous problem of reconstruction and resettlement of one million refugees from the north. In the slowly emerging order from chaos President Ngo has run into frequent criticism. He has kept the country in a virtual constant state of emergency and has kept a stern grip on the press and public opinion. Unfortunately also, his relations with his neighbors have not always been the best. Like President Syngman Rhee of the Republic of Korea, his actions frequently are high-handed. But as a staunch friend of the West, he is a valuable ally.

Federal Jurist Said Missing

CHICAGO (UPI) — Police searched today for missing Judge William Lynn Parkinson, a member of the U.S. Court of Appeals, fearing he may have suffered amnesia or been the victim of an accident.

The jurist, 57, was reported missing Tuesday night by his son, William Parkinson Jr., who told police his father had not been seen since 6 p.m. Monday shortly after he left the federal courthouse.

His wife, Elsi Ruth, said the judge had been under a doctor's care and might have suffered amnesia from the strain of hard work.

A court bailiff, Joseph M. Thines, and judicial associates said the judge told them Monday he was ill.

Leaflet Bombing Hearing Called

WASHINGTON (UPI) — At least seven U.S. agencies today were probing recent leaflet raids on Havana, a 116 g.d. from Airfields in this country to determine if any federal laws were violated.

At the same time, the five-nation Inter-American Peace Committee launched an inquiry at U.S. request to find out whether the flights were conducted by Cuban refugees from bases in Florida.

The investigations were made urgent by Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro's mounting anger at the United States. He told a cheering protest rally Monday

night that U.S. authorities either were "accomplices or murderers" or else defenseless to stop rebel flights against Cuba.

The flights, which Castro said dropped bombs as well as anti-Castro leaflets, are being investigated by the State and Justice Departments, the FBI, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, and the Federal Aviation Agency.

Customs Bureau and border patrol agents in Florida were under orders to halt the flights.

But it was not clear immediately what action the United States could take. A spokesman said the Justice Department did not have enough facts to determine whether any federal law had been violated.

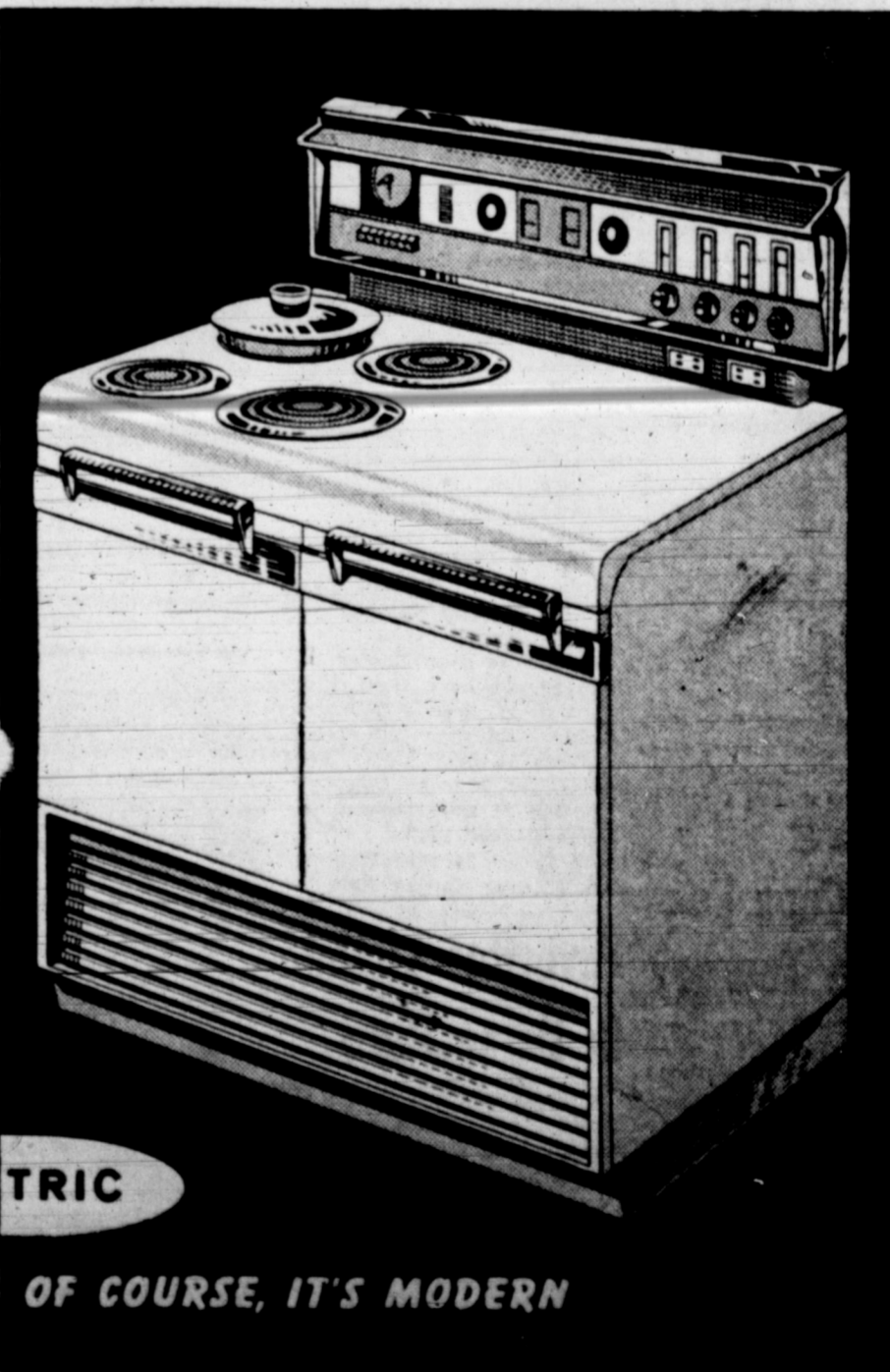

NCAA Penalizes Mississippi, Arizona For Rule Violations

BOSTON (UPI) — The National Collegiate Athletic Association's all-powerful 18-man council Tuesday night rapped the knuckles of two member colleges and ordered that other reprimands may

be issued today. Executive Director Walter Byers, acting as spokesman for the group, Tuesday night announced that the Arizona State University at Tempe and the University of Mississippi, one of the nation's leading eleven, were penalized for violating football recruiting practices sanctioned by the NCAA.

Arizona was hit with the stiffest reprimand — a two-year probation period, the first year of which the school will be barred from participation in NCAA programs. This includes athletic events, radio and television programs sponsored by or connected with the NCAA.

Mississippi, with an unbeaten football team this season, received a one year probation term but the penalty will not bar the team from participation in post-season bowl games or any other activities, according to Byers.

Though Byers would not say if other disciplinary actions would be taken today, there were indications of some additional penalties forthcoming against other schools.

The executive director would say only that at a football luncheon scheduled for today "we may have another announcement or two to make." There was an original list of 19 charges against various schools.

At the same time Arizona State and Mississippi were being reprimanded, the University of Cincinnati which had been placed on probation at the last meeting of the council in New Orleans last April, has been restored to good standing.

It is, of course, easy for me to see why the steel union would not want complete coverage of the meetings.

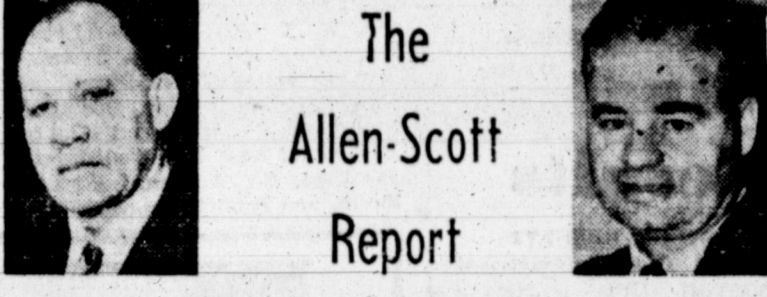
Now, let's look at what happens if the government actually forces a back-to-work movement.
