



in its context, means: Resist not him that is evil by improper means nor from improper motivations. Adding those two ideas, taken from the context, to the abbreviated statement, rationalizes it completely and easily. "This means which Christ ad-

vises are extraordinary and sagacious. He advises you to advertise your forebearance and that you be more-than-reasonable.

'The use of more-than-reasonable means may appear nonsensi-

Rep. Frank Thompson (D.N.J.) comes about as close as-possible to being the perfect spokesman for the liberal - labor position in congress. Last September The Americans for Democratic Action reported he had voted "for liberal" policies" on 11 out of 12 selected roll calls in the previous session of congress. He was absent when the remaining vote was taken. The AFL-CIO Committee for Political Education (COPE) gave Mr. Thompson a rating of 100 per cent in his voting record in the 85th Congress, which ended last De-As a member of the house edu-

cation and labor committee. Con-

gressman Thompson obediently carried the ball for the union bosses. But the McClellan committee's revelations of crime and corruption in the union movement proved too much for him. On July 30 he joined four other Democratic members of the labor committee (including Arizona's Stewart Udall) in supporting the Elliot labor bill. The five congressmen, all staunch supporters of organized labor, said the bill "provides a path of reasonable compromise for reasonable men" and "steers a sound course in correcting abuses . . while protecting the legitimate operations of labor unions." It was a mild bill, allowing unions to continue secondary boycotts and organizational picketing, doing nothing to eliminate the No Man's Land between federal and state jurisdiction of labor disputes. But the union bosses didn't like it, and the corruption - ridden teamsters union sent out word that all labor reform legislation should be killed. Mr. Thompson never had, a chance to vote for the Elliot bill.
