### Negro Voting Safeguards Still In Bill

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Atty. Gen. William P. Rogers intervened in the civil rights fight today in an effort to prevent House Republicans from joining a Southern Democratic drive to restrict the administration's voting referendum plan.  
In a letter to Rep. William M. McCulloch (R-Ohio), Rogers said the administration "strongly opposed" a Southern amendment to limit the proposed Negro voting safeguards to federal elections and exempt state or local elections.  
The Southern Democrats prepared to offer their amendment as the House began its seventh day of debate on the civil rights bill. Because of the slow pace, leaders said a final House vote would not come this week as they hoped.  
The administration plan would authorize federal judges to appoint voting referees to hear complaints that Negroes were denied their right to cast ballots. When necessary, the referees could issue certificates entitling the Negroes to vote.  
Hard-core Southern Democrats, angered by the civil rights stand of their Northern colleagues, threatened a revolt that could swing control to the GOP even if the Democrats retained the House in the November election.  
Rep. James L. Whitten (D-Miss.) announced that 22 Southern Democrats had agreed to meet after the election to map strategy. But Northern Democrats professed unconcern. They said such a rebellion would cost Southerners seniority leading to committee chairmanships.  
Other congressional news:  
**Immigration:** Senate GOP Leader Everett M. Dirksen (Ill.) was expected to introduce a bill to carry out President Eisenhower's proposed overhaul of U.S. immigration laws. Eisenhower asked Congress Thursday to permit twice as many persons to come to this country each year and to welcome refugees from persecution anywhere in the world. Rep. Francis E. Walter (D-Pa.), co-author of the present basic immigration law and chairman of the House Immigration subcommittee, accused Eisenhower of "playing election-year politics by seeking the favor of special groups."  
**Exports:** Chairman Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.) of the Senate Commerce Committee praised President Eisenhower's multi-million-dollar proposal to sell more American products overseas but suggested it might not go far enough. Magnuson said the program, also designed to stimulate the return of U.S. dollars to this country, was "certainly a step in the right direction." But he questioned whether the plan was "bold enough to meet the need."

### Dull Market Keeps Brokers In A Quandary

NEW YORK (UPI) — One outstanding worry in Wall Street these days is the failure of the stock market to generate activity on the upside.  
That situation worries the brokers as well as the traders for a dull market means fewer commissions with which to pay high rent for offices and fancy computers. Of course, no one is overlooking the worry that has been par amount since the third session of the year—a prolonged decline that knocked all the averages down sharply and deflated billions of dollars in paper profits.  
On the basis of closing Dow-Jones averages, the market fell as follows from the highs set on Jan. 5 to the lows set on March 22: Industrials off 86.37; rails off 22.25; utilities off 2.22 and the 65-stock composite, off 21.26.  
Many reasons have been set forth to explain why the market has fallen while business has produced a record first quarter economy.  
The top reason given is that there is a lack of inflation pressure which is depleting the boom psychology.  
Other reasons often mentioned are that price-earnings ratios were too high and the high yield on bonds. We have had both for a long time but no one started to sell stocks in earnest until early in the year.  
Industrial production has done ever so much better than the stock market. The Federal Reserve's production index for February is put at 167 per cent of the 1947-1949 average. That is only one point under the 168 record high set in January. Personal income set a new record high in February.  
March is expected to make a good showing but probably not as good as February because of adverse weather and the lateness of Easter. Retail trade lost in March is expected to be made up in April.  
According to some experts the market is discounting a recession in business.  
Many argue against that belief. They point out that industry has not built in any real excesses, that it plans to spend a record sum for rehabilitation of plants, and that consumer buying still is very high and without change in buying habits.  
The money market is being watched for a change in Federal Reserve policy. The board is silent on that subject as always.  
Money experts believe that if industry holds high and carries out its expansion and refurbishing program money will continue in tight supply.

### Urgy Call For Trial Of 100 Negroes

Selection of an all-white jury trial of 400 Negroes began at Orangeburg, S.C., and leaders called for nationwide boycott of chain variety stores to back up seven weeks of demonstrations in the South.  
The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, a memo issued by executive secretary Roy Wilkins, asked its local and state units to use boycott in "racial self defense." It was to go into effect immediately.  
The policy is to withhold patronage from all units of chain variety stores in all parts of the country which claim a policy in their Southern states of refusing to serve Negro customers at lunch counters on same basis as other customers, the memo said.  
Wilkins said the major chains refused to lower racial barriers in their Southern branches, the federal government "is hastily refusing to legislate state relief." He said Southern state governments support Negro lunch counter policies of the stores.  
Boycotting of a six-man jury today to try the first 15 of Negro college students arrested Tuesday at Orangeburg for firing a series of anti-segregation parades through the town. The jury was selected from an all-white venire.  
Officers using tear gas and fire broke up the parades and arrested the students with breach of peace. All were released after \$10 bond each to await trial in groups of 15.

# The Weekly Message Of Inspiration

"And certain men which came down from Judea taught the brethren, and said, except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved." Acts 15:1.

Wherever and whenever the gospel has been preached there have always been some ready to compromise it, change it, or to propose a substitute for it. There are some who feel that they have been divinely appointed to set the world right in its thinking. Some profess to believe in Jesus as Savior but change the teachings of Christ to fit their own code of religious rules.

It is very evident that these men who came down from Judea were religious quacks. They proposed a new way of salvation. They did everything they could to hinder Paul in his efforts to preach Christ. They made it hard for others to know the truth. They came from Jerusalem as if they had come from Headquarters with the last word on the matter of religion. They posed as true men when they were false. They taught error as if it were truth.

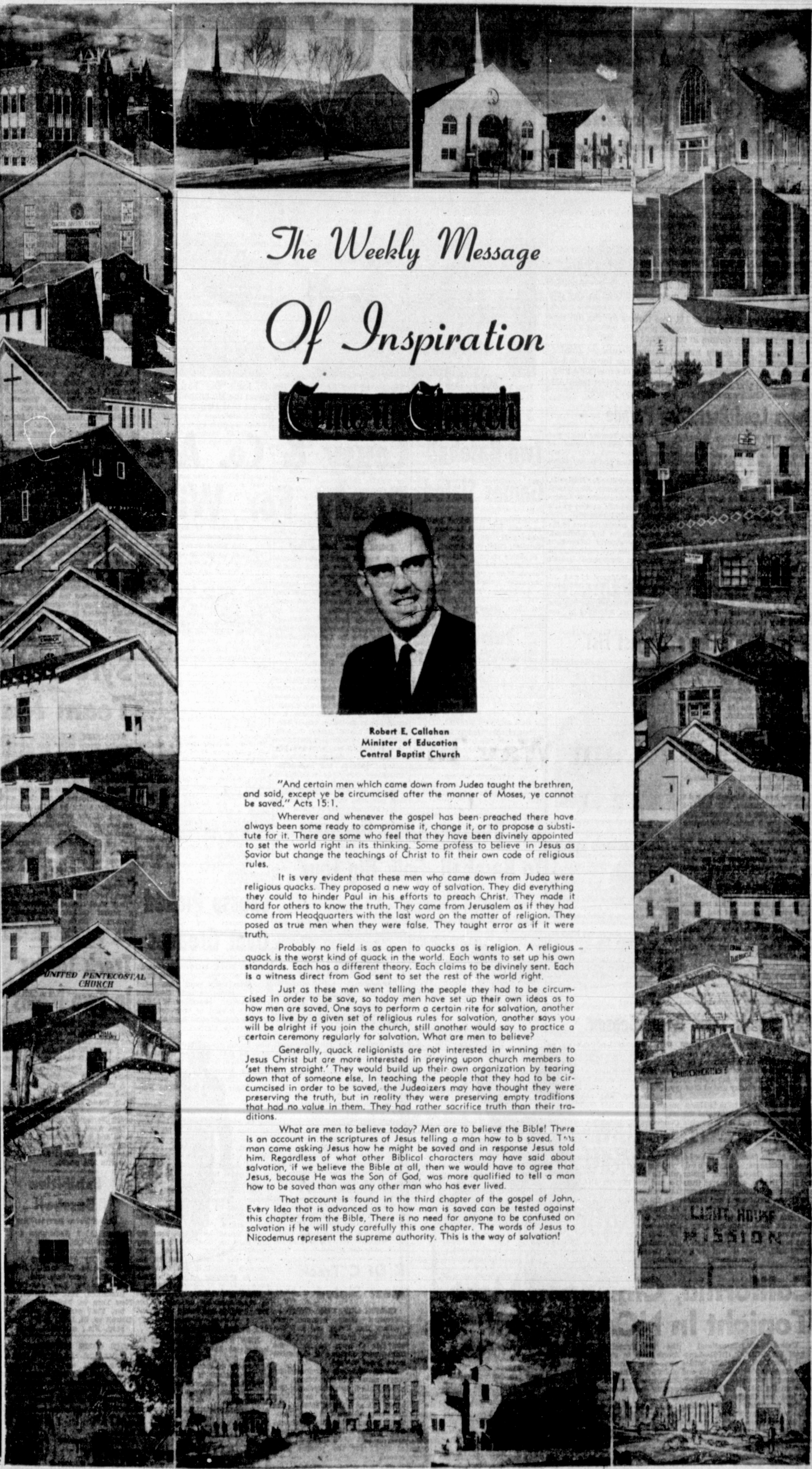
Probably no field is as open to quacks as is religion. A religious quack is the worst kind of quack in the world. Each wants to set up his own standards. Each has a different theory. Each claims to be divinely sent. Each is a witness direct from God sent to set the rest of the world right.

Just as these men went telling the people they had to be circumcised in order to be saved, so today men have set up their own ideas as to how men are saved. One says to perform a certain rite for salvation, another says to live by a given set of religious rules for salvation, another says you will be alright if you join the church, still another would say to practice a certain ceremony regularly for salvation. What are men to believe?

Generally, quack religionists are not interested in winning men to Jesus Christ but are more interested in preying upon church members to 'set them straight.' They would build up their own organization by tearing down that of someone else. In teaching the people that they had to be circumcised in order to be saved, the Judeoizers may have thought they were preserving the truth, but in reality they were preserving empty traditions that had no value in them. They had rather sacrifice truth than their traditions.

What are men to believe today? Men are to believe the Bible! There is an account in the scriptures of Jesus telling a man how to be saved. This man came asking Jesus how he might be saved and in response Jesus told him. Regardless of what other Biblical characters may have said about salvation, if we believe the Bible at all, then we would have to agree that Jesus, because He was the Son of God, was more qualified to tell a man how to be saved than was any other man who has ever lived.

That account is found in the third chapter of the gospel of John. Every idea that is advanced as to how man is saved can be tested against this chapter from the Bible. There is no need for anyone to be confused on salvation if he will study carefully this one chapter. The words of Jesus to Nicodemus represent the supreme authority. This is the way of salvation!



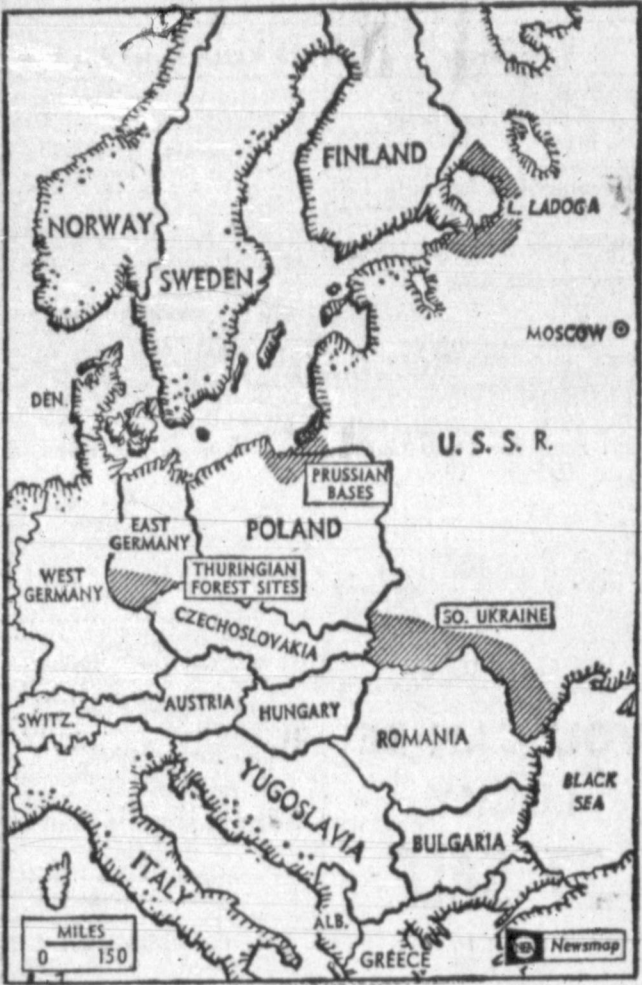

**NEW YORK (UPI)** — Electronics is the very heart of space and automation developments and has become a dynamic industry packed with unparalleled potentials for the investor, Thomson & McKinnon reports.

It's no wonder, therefore, that sales in this industry have rocketed from \$2,600,000,000 in 1959 to \$9,200,000,000 in 1959—an increase of 15.1 per cent or nearly three times the growth rate of our gross national product, the study notes.

Reynolds & Co. believes the stock of National Vulcanized Tire is reasonably priced considering the company's good prospects in the period ahead. Earnings rebounded sharply last year and the

dividend rate was recently boosted to 25 cents a share from 20 cents.

Gersen of Wall Street cautions the investor against becoming "overly pessimistic." "... we must remember that while the year 1960 will not be as glittering as the predictions, it will still be a good year for business—and a good year for stocks which are selling ... at prices which we believe to be low, rather than high."

No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and Mammon. (St. Matthew 6:24.)

It is a blunt statement: "No man can serve two masters." Millions try it, however, not realizing that when it comes to Christ and his church there is no such thing as neutrality. Either we are for Him or we are against Him. "He that is not with Me is against Me." Conceivably, I can be neu-

tral at a football game; I am not forced to hate one team and love the other. But great faith demands wholehearted allegiance.

"No man can serve two masters." It was out of our Lord's experience that He learned that the chief enemies of God are not the men who revile God, who despise Him, but the men who claim the privilege of being neutral. "I let my wife handle this church business," says many a man, thinking he can be an agreeable observer on the sidelines in the battle between good and evil. But he is not neutral. His action is a negative spiritual influence on his children, his neighbors, his country.

See Christ before Pontius Pilate, a pathetic figure. Said he, "I find no fault in this man." But because the people continued to cry, "crucify him" and because they told him that unless he went along with their desire to be rid of Jesus he would not be Caesar's friend, he took a bowl and washed his hands, saying that he was innocent of the blood of Christ, that he would step out of the picture. He stepped right into the middle of the Apostles' Creed. The pathetic, vacillating figure of a man who thought he could be neutral about Christ. "No man can serve two masters!" In this day of the cold war, with the

whole world having to choose between the Communist manifesto and the Gospel of Christ, we must stand up and be counted. We are in a struggle between tyranny and freedom, between human dignity and regimentation, between atheism and at least religious liberty. There are no neutral people.
