Recovery Boss Sure to Be Free Murray and Of State Department Control CIO Indicted

WASHINGTON-(AP)-A European recovery boss who won't have to take orders from the State Department appears a certainty today.

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee agreed unanimously last night to create a \$20,000-a-year independent Marshall Plan administrator.

He would rank equally with the scretary of state and other cabinet members and any dispute would be settled by the President.

The administrator would be advised by a 12-member board of private citizens and would report to a 14-member congres-

Under the Taft-Hartley Act, a union or corporation found guilty of political spending can be fined up to \$5,000. Its officials can be fined up to \$1,000 and jailed for a year. Pot-Bellied Stove?



N Most folks fixed their own with a screwdriver or pliers. And when they did come in for service, there was no hurry-everything was nice and informal. You might just sit near the potbeilied stove and talk with the mechanic while he fixed the car.
