





A lot of people are wondering now what tangible benefits, over and above social security, they are going to get from this promised longer life. Among other things, they are wondering about the cost of life insurance.

The insurance people saved up this nice little longevity surprise to spring along with another one which is unavoidable but not so pleasant. The rate of earning on life insurance investments—and most other safe investments—has been declining while our life expectancy has been rising. It has one down from 5.25 percent in

1925 to 2.92 percent at present.

A general practice of life insurance companies has been to guarantee the holders of partici-pating policies around 3 or 3 1-2 percent interest. But with their present earnings they feel this is unsafe. So, on or before Jan. 1, great majority of them will




