Junk-Filled, Barricaded House Gives Up Body; Sisters Wealthy

LYNDBROOK, N. Y.—(AP)—A rag-wrapped 400-pound spinster—one of two reportedly wealthy sisters—died Sunday in the barricaded and junk-filled house where they had retired from the world ten years ago.

A doctor had to climb through a kitchen window to reach the body of Elsie Wolff, 43, who apparently died of a heart attack.

Police then battered down the nailed and bolted rear door of the crumbling two-story, five-room frame house.

"Mother wanted us to live here," said the surviving sister, Edith, 47, who had cared for the semi-invalid Elsie.

Both sisters had attended New York University.

The sisters, their neighbors said, locked themselves in the kitchen after the death of their father, Harry, a well-to-do Lynbrook, Long Island, merchant. Their mother, Lena, died about 20 years ago.

Stacks of tin cans, boxes, newspapers and other debris littered the kitchen. The other rooms were crammed with junk and with merchandise—mostly unsalable—which they had moved from their father's store.

The house was without electricity, gas or water. A kerosene stove in the kitchen was the only comfort.

Almost the only contact the sisters had with the world was through neighborhood children who were paid small sums to fetch groceries from a neighborhood store and pails of water from nearby taps.

A relative estimated the sisters' total wealth at \$100,000. Police found a bank book showing a balance of \$12,000.

Once in a while, the elder sister left the house to draw funds from a bank.

Sunday, she leaned out a kitchen window and called to a passing boy to summon a doctor for Elsie. Six men were needed to carry out the body.

The surviving sister Edith said she will continue to live in the house, because that is the way her mother would want it.

The only decoration in the kitchen was an oil painting of the mother. On it were pinned many brightly-colored ribbons—one on each of her birthdays.

Police Seek Death Club

DUNCAN, OKLA.—(AP)—"The worst killing in the history of Stephens County" today spurred officers on the hunt for a three-cornered murder weapon.

They believe some special instrument was used to batter in the head of a 26-year-old Indian waitress, Helen Beavers.

Her body, partly stripped, was found yesterday stuffed in the trunk of an automobile unused since Christmas.

County Attorney Hegel Branch, who called it the county's worst killing, said her head was beaten to a pulp by 12 blows, any one of them fatal.

At the same time, Hegel continued questioning three men arrested shortly after the discovery. Two of them were in a party the young woman left the night of Jan. 27 to keep a midnight date with another man. She was not seen again alive.

The find was made by R. C. Gentry, owner of the car. He left Duncan for hospital care in Oklahoma City at Christmas and did not return to drive his car until Sunday. When he noticed an unusual weight dragging down the back of the machine he investigated.

It has not been determined whether she was raped.

FBI Arrests Head of Reds

NEW YORK—(AP)—John Williamson, labor secretary of the American Communist Party, was arrested by FBI agents at his home today on a deportation warrant.

Described by the agents as a native of Scotland, Williamson was taken to Ellis Island. Immigration service officials announced he would be held there pending a hearing on the warrant.

A Justice Department official said in Washington Williamson was "the most important figure in the Communist Party" against whom the department has taken action so far.

Williamson, whose home was given as Ohio when he was named secretary of the Communist Political Association preceding the 1944 presidential campaign, was arrested as he left his home in upper Manhattan.

Gerhart Eisler, described by a House committee as America's "No. 1 Communist," also is held at Ellis Island on a deportation warrant.

The Justice Department said Williamson "has been posing as an American citizen for many years, whereas he is an alien."

INCREASED CONSUMPTION

Americans consumed 19 pounds of candy per capita during 1945, compared with only 16 pounds per capita in 1938, despite curtailed supplies of sugar and chocolate and the fact that 20 percent of all candy manufactured went to the armed forces.

Of the 279 kidnapping cases investigated by the FBI from the enactment of the federal kidnapping statute in 1932 to the close of the 1945 fiscal year, 277 were solved.
