## Transcript Expected To Help Clear Mystery

today rushed to complete the transcript of the last recorded words between the airport towers and the pilots of two airliners which collided over New York, killing 134 persons. An FAA spokesman said the transcript, which may shed additional light on the cause of the world's worst air

disaster, should be ready for release during the aftern on. The agency originally planned to release the records at 10 a.m., but the spokesman said stenographers were still transcribing the tape recordings made prior to their crash.

The 60-page transcript of the Hard Freeze conversations was expected to provide clues in the mystery of how the Trans World Airlines Super Constellation and the United Air Lines DC8 jet collided Friday in a snowstorm while under ground radar observation and instrument flying rules.

The jetliner crashed into Brooklyn after the collision, setting fire to four blocks of apartment houses, shops and a church. The TWA plane smashed down in Staten Island in a field. 





EYE ON THE GROUND—A new type of radar is being installed at the nation's major airports to relieve ground traffic bottlenecks. Ordinary radar can detect planes in the air for hundreds of miles but does not give a picture of the airport itself or objects close up. The new radarscope, developed by Airborne Instruments Laboratory, has a special antenna which can see planes, trucks and even men on the field in any kind of weather. Top photo shows Washington National Airport, the third airport to be so equipped (others are Newark and Idlewild). Bottom photo shows how it looks on the remarkable surface radar.

NEW YORK, N.Y. - First leves are lasting loves. You never lose that wonderful tug, that quickening of the heart. I was a gaunt and gangling kid running the avenues of Mexico City with equall, nutty little dopes when Bleriot first flew across the English Channel. Of nine of us, three that day fell in love with airplanes. We made them from old sheets and boxes and flew them across jungles, mountains and seas - in our hearts. The best Christmas I ever had was the one in which my discerning father gave me an airplane I could sit in, as one sits in a toy automobile today. It had little wings about three feet long. You sat in a seat and you pedalled. Other kids pedalled toy cars - I pedalled a plane, and it wasn't metal. It was canvas stretched across metal frames and painted. Never did find out where he got it, because it was the only one in Mexico City.

The time came when I had the means and will to learn to fly and did. I never was good at it. Might as well get that put down straight off. I was all right, didn't wreck a plane or break my legs. But never in a thousand years would I have been a good flyer. Not really good. I could get one up off the ground and bring it back down in one piece. I could do turns and keep the nose up and never feel fear, but that was about all. Journeyman flyer. Sunday flyer.

The coming of the second big war put an end to that in California. The man who had taught me went off to the war, the doctor I admired so as a fiyer went into the Air Force as a Colonel and flight surgeon. The old gang bled away into nothing.

After the war, I bad new children and time and stiffened up the reflexes. It didn't make sense to get back at something I never would master. This is the way people get killed in airplanes. They insist on doing it after it is getting awfully late. Walking down Broadway from

the 70's early the other sparkling, diamond-like morning I ran into a television engineer I know and he said he was going over to three-hour flight and why didn't I come along. I said, fine, sure, why not? Didn't even ask him if he could fly and what did he own or rent. We took a cab over to the little airfield and there was the finest small airplane ever made in the United States of America. The finest. A Navion. The company lost money on every one they made and sold and finally had to stop making them. They are fast, sensible, intelligent airplanes and made, I'm sure, from a stroke of genius that seared designer one day.

We got in and he started the engine, warmed up and we went out onto the runway. He picked up his little radio gimmick and identified himself, described his flight intentions, received instructions from the tower and off we went. He could fly. Man, could he fly! He was a natural. It had seemed pointless to ask him if he could. Now I knew he could. He had the use of hands and feet and the dart of eye, the sit, that says

We zipped over that end of Manhattan, across the East River, up it until it became Long Island Sound, talking and loving the view and what was happening in this superb little flying perfection called a Navion.
