# U.N. Sentries Finally Relax

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI)—The good-looking guard in the pale blue uniform stomped his feet inside the telephone booth sentry box and ignored people walking into the big building. Three months ago today he was stopping everyone for photograph-mounted passes while police on horseback held back crowds pressing for a peek at Eisenhower or Khrushchev or Macmillan or Castro or Tito or Nasser or Nehru. The 15th General Assembly of the United Nations was coming to a temporary close. Inside, looking down on the ornate hall where the most powerful of world leaders had sat for four frantic weeks, the eye gravitated to the green-covered desk at the back with the nameplate: "Union of Soviet Socialist Republics."

In the background was the same bloody upheaval in the Congo that had been there when the delegates assembled last Sept. 20. The delegate from Israel was warning that it could lead to another Spanish-type civil war, another Korea. The session was open to the public Tuesday but less than one-fourth of the seats were filled. # Handwriting Betrays Ex-Nazi Prison Boss

FRANKFURT, Germany (UPI)—Former S. S. Maj. Richard Baer, who began his career as a candy-maker and wound up as commandant of the infamous Auschwitz concentration camp, was jailed here today—betrayed by his own handwriting.

State Prosecutor Heinz Wolf said Baer was not positively identified until police compared his police registration with an old registration from Berlin. Wolf said Baer would be charged with the deaths of "innumerable inmates" at Auschwitz who were gassed by his order and with the mass murder of prisoners who were marched out of the camp when the Russians approached.

Baer was confronted by two policemen Tuesday in North Germany where he had been hiding for the past 15 years under the alias of Karl Neuman, as a laborer on the estate of Prince Otto von Bismarck.

The 49-year-old former S. S. officer denied the charge at first, but later admitted his identity. "I was an officer," Baer told police after they arrested him. "Treat me as an officer."

**SKELTON'S RELEASE DUE**

# Wall Street In Review

NEW YORK (UPI) — The performance of the market in the past two months is causing a significant change in the market opinions of the professionals and the analysts in Wall Street, according to the Investor Research Co. The refusal of the market to break the September low; the post-election rally; the length of time the market has held above 600 — all are being viewed as very favorable omens by the pros, especially in the face of a rather pallid business outlook. Investors Research reports that these people have not shouted "bull market" in so many words but "are looking for something very big."

To them, IR says, the market picture has crystallized and it is a matter of time until the preliminary indications jell into a favorable environment for the market as a whole. Some improvement in the bond market is likely early in 1961, but no return to the very low yields seen during the 1957-58 recession is in prospect, according to United Business Service. It forecasts a moderate decline in bond prices during the second half of 1961, and for the year as a whole the trend is expected to be slightly down.

James F. Hughes of Auchincloss, Redpath & Parker writes that there is justification for believing that the disappointing performance of the stock market had more to do with the business recession than fundamental economic factors. Now that the technical background is extremely favorable it is conceivable that an encouraging advance in the stock market could prove to be an important psychological factor in reversing the declining trend in industrial activity, Hughes says.

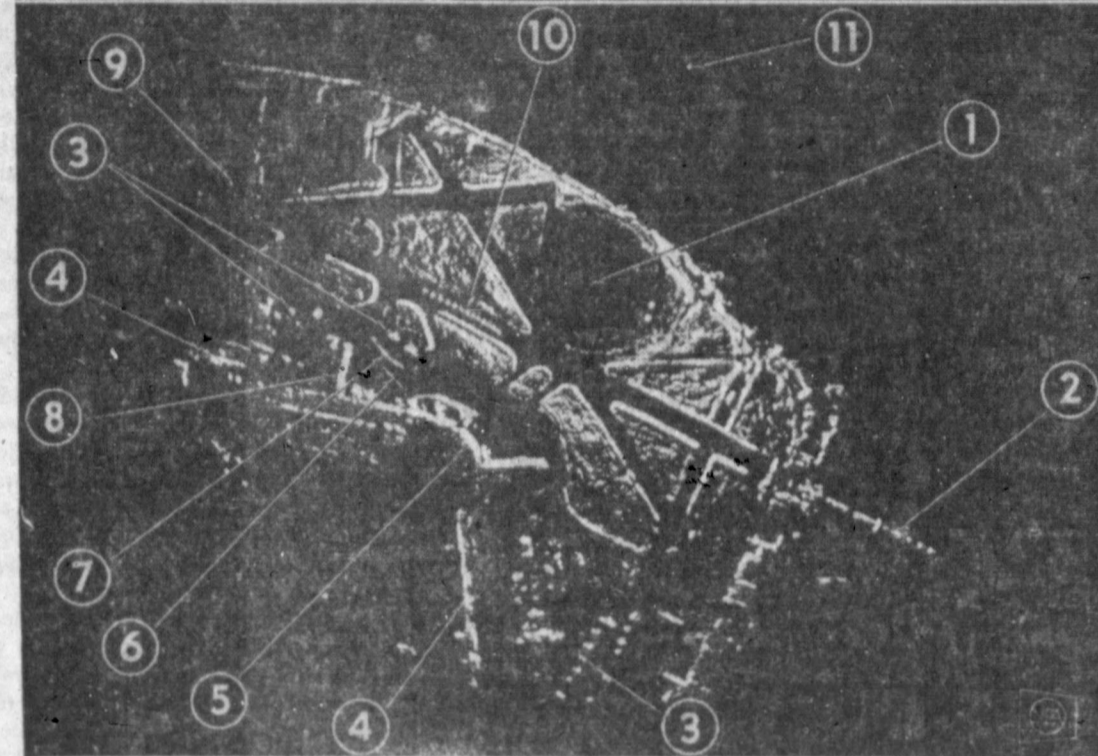

## Foreign Commentary

It had been just 11 months ago that President Charles de Gaulle, wearing his World War II brigadier general's uniform, appeared on French television to warn rebellious French settlers barricaded in the streets of Algiers: "Let everyone know and know well that I shall not go back on this decision."

To bow to the settlers fighting his decision for Algerian self-determination would mean, he said, that "France would become no more than a poor, dislocated toy on the sea of unknown peril."

As the date neared for a national referendum on his two-step plan for an "Algerian Algeria," De Gaulle flew to Algeria to rally support of the French army, the

one group that could assure failure for his plan, if not its success.

The results left De Gaulle white-faced and grim.

In the heavily European cities of Algiers, Bonn and Oran, European settlers poured into the streets in violent demonstrations against De Gaulle. From the casbahs and the shanty towns, Moslems carrying hand-stitched green, white and red flags of the Moslem independence forces poured to meet them.

Moslem cries of "Vive de Gaulle" soon turned to "Vive Abbas"—Ferhat Abbas, chief of the national liberation front.

De Gaulle, shortening his tour, returned to Paris with the memory of at least 128 dead in the three-way clashes involving the French army, the European settlers and the city Moslems. But his determination was undaunted.

"There is only one policy," he said, "and we have to follow it because it is the right one."

It was in keeping with the legend of De Gaulle, single-handedly guiding French destinies, walking in lonely splendor under the Cross of Lorraine.

But more than that, De Gaulle's tour, tragic as it was in loss of life, had brought to the surface drastic changes in what had been the accepted picture of Algeria.

By their silence, it had been assumed that Algeria's city Moslems would not oppose the European settlers' determination to keep Algeria French. That theory was disposed of by the mass appearance of rebel flags.

As for the settlers, they had committed a seemingly fatal error in underestimating the army's loyalty to De Gaulle. The army, for the first time, fired on both Moslem and settler.

## Court Upholds Conviction In Party Line Case

TRENTON, N.J. (UPI)—The conviction of a housewife as a disorderly person for refusing to yield a telephone party line for a doctor's emergency call, was upheld in the State Supreme Court.

The case involved the first conviction in the nation in the 30 states which have passed laws against tying up party lines in an emergency, the high court said.

The court affirmed the conviction and \$200 fine against Mrs. Mary C. Zelinski, of Millburn, N.J., who contended it must have been the other woman on the line who told Dr. Marvin C. Breker: "Dr. Becker, I never heard of you. You can go to hell... I don't care about you or your patient."

## Obituaries

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sen. Elect Keith Thomson, R-Wyo., was buried with full military honors Tuesday at Arlington National Cemetery.

Thomson, a member of House who was elected to the Senate in November, died of a heart attack on Dec. 9. He was 41 years old.

Thomson received the military burial because of his World War II service in Europe, where he commanded an infantry battalion.

RICHMOND, Va. (UPI)—Associate Justice Willis D. Miller, 67, of the Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals died Tuesday of a heart ailment.

PITTSBURGH (UPI)—Retired Federal Judge Nelson McVicar, 89, an appointee of the late President Calvin Coolidge, died Tuesday night.

Although he retired officially Feb. 1, 1951, after 23 years on the bench, McVicar continued to sit in federal court here to aid in clearing a heavy backlog of cases in the Western Pennsylvania district.

SATURN ENGINES TESTED  
HUNTSVILLE, Ala. (UPI)—The Saturn rocket booster's eight engines developed 1.3 million pounds of thrust Tuesday in a 60-second test firing at the Marshall Space Flight Center here.

The rocket, too big for ground of air transportation to Cape Canaveral for flight testing, will be ferried to the Cape soon by river barge.

CHICAGO (UPI)—A bomb squad gingerly opened a ticking Christmas package at the Post Office Tuesday and found a battery-powered electric shaver, busily working away.

## Last-Minute Gift Ideas Are Yours To Make

What to give — oh, what a question — with Christmas nearly upon us! Why not make a couple of last-minute gifts? A personal gift is especially appreciated and makes a really worthwhile present.  
Stoles are quick and easy. Rayon is inexpensive. To make a stole, buy 2 1/4 yards of 48-inch fabric. Clip selvages and stitch together on the wrong side. Cross the ends can be fringed. Silk chiffon can be done in the same way. These stoles are good for year-round wearing.  
Woolen mittens with gauntlet cuffs make a wonderful gift for men who drive. Buy 2 1/2-inch of ribbon, stretch the top of the mitten as you stitch ribbon on it. Sew two palms from an old glove, hand-sew these to the mitten

to give a good grip for the wheel.  
Bed jackets are a delight to receive and so easy to make. They are especially pretty when made in a favorite color of nylon velvet with a nylon lace trim.  
Aprons are always practical. Made of gaily striped denim, they are sure to please young home makers.  
Personalized towels and washcloths are "sure-fire" gifts. A big script, plainly stitched initials or monograms can be put on quickly by machine. Write on ruled tablet, so sizes of letters are uniform. Pin to towel. After stitching, tear away paper.  
Pot holders in gay colors can be made to match or contrast in kitchen color. Use old bath towels for padding inside. Make 9 x 7-

inch size, large enough to hold a roasting pan or casserole. Three of these, script-initialed, are ideal as gifts, and so economical.  
Blanket covers single or double make decorative and practical gifts. Buy 5 yards flowered Dacron for full-size bed, or 7 1/2 yards for twin beds. Cut 5-yard length in half for double bed. For twin beds, cut in three lengths. Split one and stitch to a full width. Machine hem raw edges. Stitch lace on all sides diagonal fold to hold.  
Christmas gifts that show thought for the persons receiving them are always treasured.  
Dear Mrs. Picken: Please tell me how to stitch leather. — A. L. J.  
Dear A. L. J.: Set your machine gauge 7 or 8 stitches to the inch. Use size 14 needle unless leather is very heavy, then use a No. 16. Use cotton thread. If wrong side is rough at all, use tissue upper underneath so leather will slide easily over the feed plate.

# Motorists Warned Highways Will Be Heavily Patrolled During Holidays

Speeding drivers and other traffic law violators will run a veritable obstacle course of highway patrol cruisers and radar speed checks during Christmas and New Year holiday trips this year when the Department of Public Safety holds "Operation Deathwatch."

"So far in 1960, Texas traffic deaths are below the number recorded at the same date in 1959," said Sgt. E. G. Albers. "However in an effort to keep this grim figure to the absolute minimum, we have been ordered on a round-the-clock duty to stop traffic violators during Operation Deathwatch."

Operation Deathwatch starts throughout Texas at 12:01 a.m.

Dec. 23 and runs through 11:59 a.m. Jan. 1, the Sgt. Albers explained. "All members of the Motor Vehicle Inspection, License and Weight and Safety Education Services will be added to the regular Highway Patrol staff in a determined effort to apprehend all traffic law violators," he added.

"Since 1955, traffic deaths in Texas during the Christmas holidays have been less each year than the predicted figures," Sgt. Albers said. "We know this is because of public cooperation with the Department of Public Safety and because we have many additional officers on traffic law enforcement duty."

In last year's fatal Christmas

accidents in Texas, all but one were caused by violations of one or more traffic laws, the Sgt. cautioned. The drinking driver was involved in 32 per cent of last year's fatal Christmas accidents, while 54 per cent listed speeding as a causative factor.

Three simple "rules of the road" for the holiday season, listed by Sgt. Albers, are: 1 — allow ample time for the trip; 2 — stop occasionally for rest breaks; 3 — report unsafe acts by other drivers.

"By allowing plenty of time for the trip, you will not have to speed to get to your destination on time," Sgt. Albers said. "Occasional stops for rest will keep you mentally

Miss Keller was a stewardess aboard the United Airlines plane which was in collision with a Trans World Airliner and was one of the 134 persons who died in the air tragedy. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Keller of Hawthorne. She resided in McLean about six year ago.

## Celts Hold Slim Lead

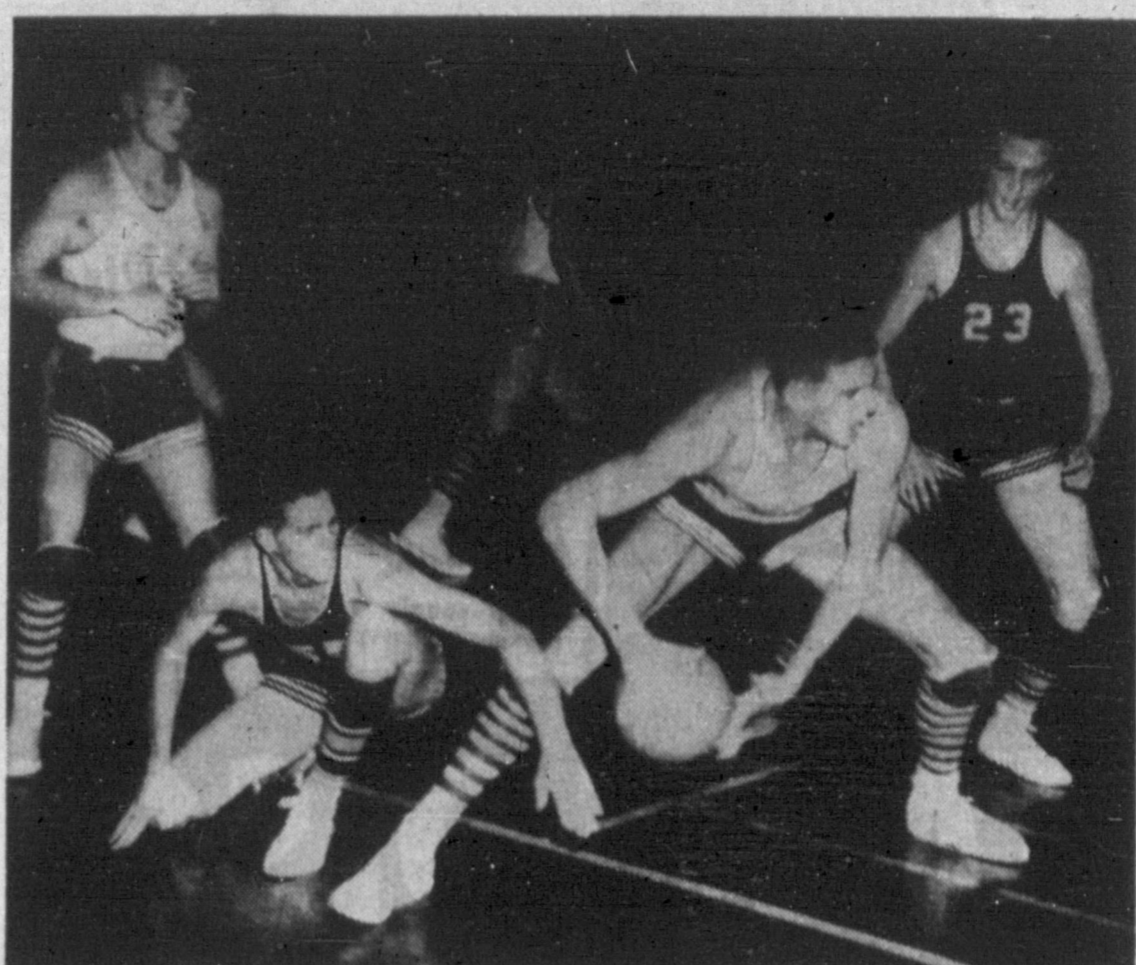

## Carter, Wise, Matson Spark Clutch PHS Win

Relying on the domination of the backboards by Allen Wise and Randy Matson and the pinpoint shooting of Pat Carter, the Pampa Harvesters nipped the Dumas Demons, 40-39, in a non-conference basketball cliffhanger at the Harvesters Gym last night.

The victory boosted the Harvesters to a 3-4 mark for the season and handed Dumas its third loss of the season and second by one point in 11 outings.

In the preliminary game, the Harvesters ran their latest win string to three in a row with a 59-53 defeat of Dumas 'B', giving the Harvesters a 6-3 record.

Outside of the ever-present Carter — who rammed in 22 points — the decisive factor in the game was PHS' rebounding. The Green and Gold outrebounded Dumas 37-19, getting 21 of the loose balls in the second half while Dumas was limited to a scant five.

Wise, 6-3, and Matson, 6-5, did most of the Harvesters board work, with Wise pulling down 11 and Matson 16.

Dumas took an early 2-1 lead after a jump shot by Larry Tiner, the Demon ace who was held to 12 points by the stellar defensive play of Harvester Gordon Balch, and a Carter free throw. However, Bill Neslage tallied on a beautiful driving layup and hit a foul shot on the same play to send Pampa into a 4-2 lead at 5:15.

It was Neslage again, with only 46 seconds remaining on the first period clock, who gave Pampa an 8-7 first quarter lead when he scored on a drive through a mass of Dumas players.

With Carter catching fire in the second period, Pampa went ahead 10-7 on Carter's soft jump off the backboard; 12-9 on another Carter jump and 14-11 on a Carter drive. However, Rector hit two free tosses and Tiner meshed a jumper to send Dumas into a short-lived 15-14 lead at 3:20 of the second quarter.

Neslage tied the game up again a moment later with a free throw and Carter banged home another jump to send the Harvesters ahead 19-15; but Dumas' Joe McCormick pumped in a shot after rebounding the ball to cut Pampa's lead to 19-17 at halftime intermission.

Pampa and Dumas traded point for point in the third period — each scoring nine — but the Harvesters went ahead to stay at 4:38 of the third period when Balch intercepted a pass and soloed the length of the court for a crippler and gave PHS a 25-23 margin.

Ahead 28-26 going into the harvesting fourth quarter, Pampa opened up its biggest lead of the night — five points — at 37-32 when Matson and Wise hit a bracket of free throws each as the Harvesters' stalling defense brought on the fouts.

In front 38-34 with 1:01 left, Tom Boulware hit a free throw and Rector scored on a drive to trim Pampa's lead to one, 38-37.

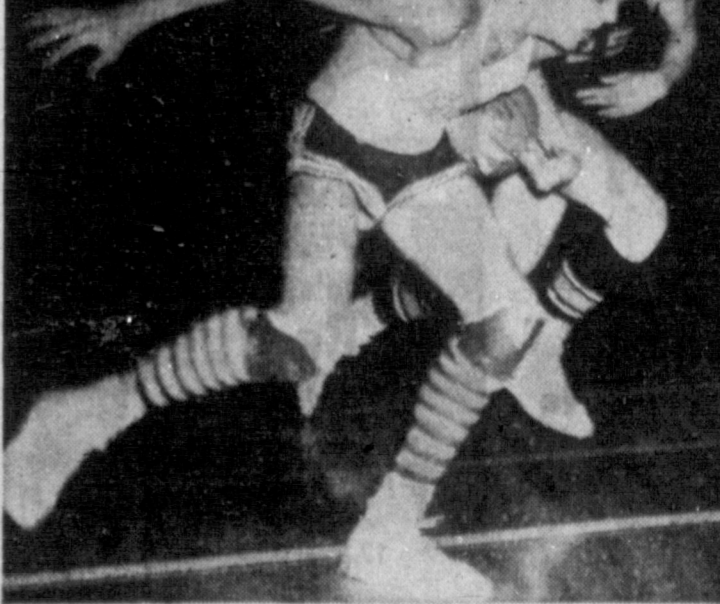
With 18 seconds left, Carter was fouled by an over-eager Demon and the cool senior bucketed both throws to give Pampa some breathing room, 40-37.

However, Dumas — which had beaten Amarillo by one point and Borger by two in last week's games — looked like they might pull it out of the fire when Larry Taylor hit a jump with 7 seconds remaining and a missed Pampa free throw on an intentional backcourt foul gave Dumas the ball.

However, Tiner stepped out of bounds in the backcourt as he prepared a last-second heave and the game ended, none too soon for the happy Harvesters.

Dumas helped Pampa quite a bit with its poor shooting percentage, hitting only 13 of 53 from the field, a less-than-spectacular 24 per cent, while Coach Terry Culley's crew hit 11 of 33, 34 per cent.

The Harvesters, outshot outside, won the game at the free throw line, hitting 18 to Dumas' 13.

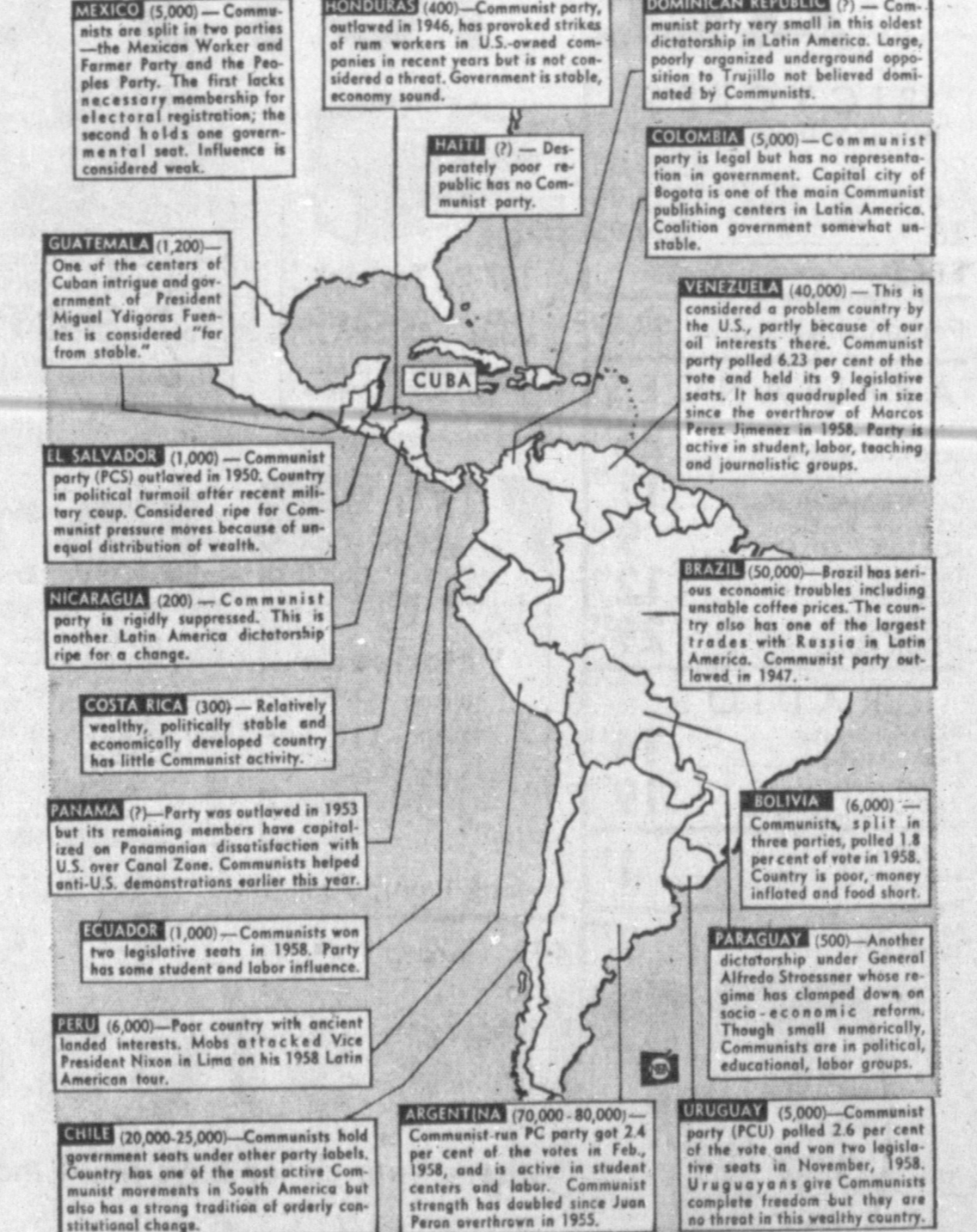

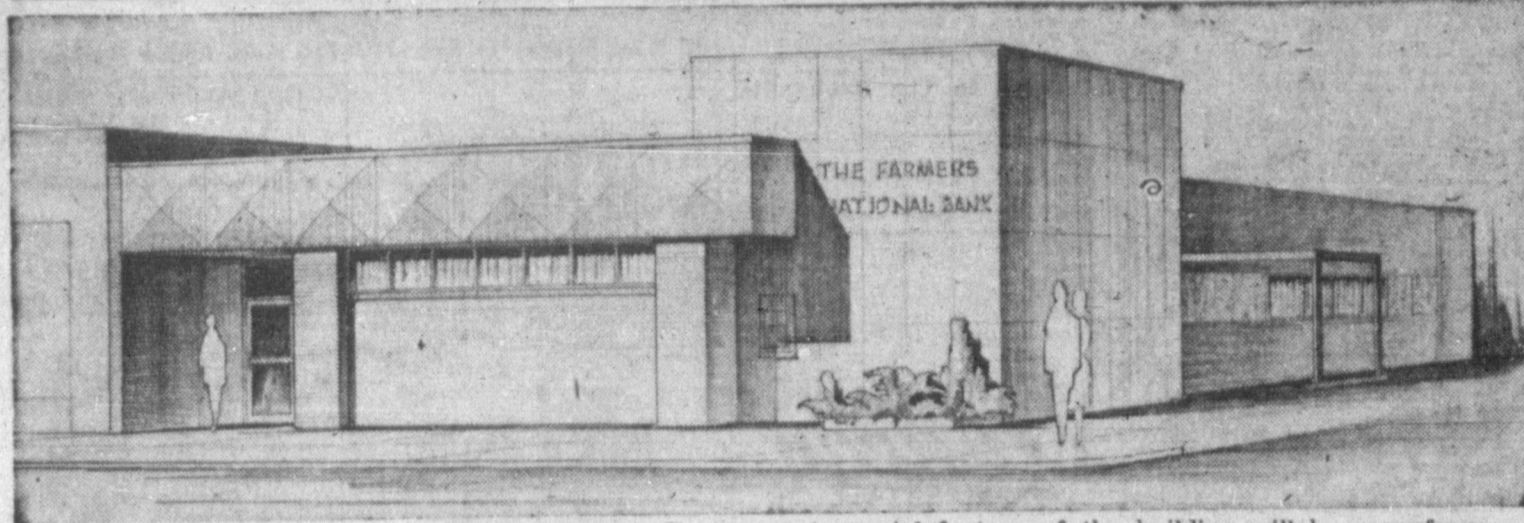

### Tax Saving Group Speeds Up Work

AUSTIN (UPI) — State Rep. Wesley Roberts of Lamesa, chairman of the House Committee on Saving Texas, said yesterday he would appoint subcommittees of his group "to speed up the many separated phases of our investigations."

Roberts said he hoped to draft a final report on ways to cut state expenses by Jan. 10, when the Legislature meets.

### Financial Review

NEW YORK (UPI) — Urban New York architect who said a large part of the trouble with downtown stores is simply that they have fallen behind the times in modern architectural planning.

Morris Ketchum Jr., partner in the architectural firm of Ketchum and Sharp, said department stores in the next few years are going to woo old and new customers alike by extensive and long overdue remodeling and modernization programs.

These programs, along with continued efforts to solve traffic and other problems, will help strike a healthy balance of trade between downtown and suburbs, Ketchum declared.

He noted that since World War II many downtown stores have concentrated their efforts on opening branches in the suburbs and have "sadly neglected" their downtown headquarters.

"No store can expect a woman to make a trip downtown to select a new hat or dress in the same old setting she knew as a girl," the architect stated.

Economic forces also are making modernization programs imperative, and Ketchum estimated that as much as 40 per cent of space in older stores is not being used productively because of the outmoded layout and obsolete fixtures. He said no store in a high rent area can afford that kind of waste.
