

whelming House approval. The election-year measure fell far short of rival proposals backed by organized labor and the Eisenhower administration. These programs would provide benefits for most of the 16 million persons over 65.

The House bill would offer federal grants to any state that wanted to expand its public assistance program to include medical care benefits for elderly persons who can't afford medical at tention but aren't poor enough qualify for relief checks.

The measure was taken up un de, a rule that barred amendments to expand it.

Democrats were expected to fight in the Senate to widen the bill to include some version of labor-backed plan to add medical care to Social Security benefits. The final version then would be worked out by Senate-House conferees.

Other congressional news: Minimum Wage: The Senate Labor subcommittee was expected to approve today a bill to raise the federal minimum wage gradually from \$1 to \$1.25 an hour and extend coverage to an additional 5,123,000 workers. Sen John Stennis (D-Mass.) launched a drive to rally opposition. He said the legislation would drive out of business many small manufacturers, retailers, loggers and other companies.

Cuba: The House Agriculture Committee summoned Secretary of State Christian A. Herter to explain whether the administra tion wants Congress to rap Fidel Castro by cutting Cuba's sugar marketing quota in the United States. President Eisenhower asked for power to change quotas of sugar-supply countries but promised not to use the authority


