> years, me affliction runs its course in a few days, weeks or months in children. World-wide statistics indicate that the prevalence of leukemia is rapidily and progressively increasing. For example, there were an estimated 3.7 cases per 100.000 population in the United States in 1940. In 1956, the figure had risen to 6.1, an increase of 40 per cent.

There appears to be a direct relationship between the increasing prevalence of leukemia and the increasing contamination of our tissues with ironizing radiation. Our tissues become contaminated with radiation through normal background sources to which our bodies have become more or less adapted and about which we

can do little or nothing.
