LOS ANGÉLES (UPI) - Sen. John F. Kennedy lost a few votes today in frantic last minute maneuvers at the Democratic national convention but remained a top heavy favorite to win the presidential nomination at today's session.

#### New Attitude In Stiff Note

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Nikita S. Khrushchev was under a stern American warning today that Russia would provoke "the most serious consequences" if it shot down any more U.S. planes over international waters.

A stiff-worded U.S. note delivered to the Kremlin said an Air Force RB-47 reconnaissance bomber was on an "entirely legitimate mission" over the high seas in the arctic when a Soviet fighter blasted it from the sky

The warning was this country's reply to Khrushchev's charge that the aircraft had violated Russian airspace while on an espionage

The note appeared to represent a tougher U.S. attitude toward the Russian premier's stream of charges and attacks. The incident brought a new chill to the cold war just two months after the U-2 spy plane affair and sent jitters through other Western capitals.

# Sam Rushes About Seeking Combination

LOS ANGELES, July 13-Speaker Sam Rayburn is undertaking a last-ditch effort to weld an alliance of Johnson-Symington forces behind the former - the majority leader of the Senate.

In this Tramatic backstage move, Rayburn has made a spectacular proposal to former President Tru-

Under this plan, Truman would strikingly cement the advocated Johnson - Symington coalition by placing the Texas Senator in nomination at tonight's session of the

For Truman to do this would mean reversing himself on Senator Symington, whom he endorsed for

this presidency. It would also entail the withdrawal of the Missouri senator from the tense struggle for the nomination.

A significant hint that this is under consideration came from Rep. Charles Brown, Mo., Symington's campaign manager.

To a staff writer of the Los Angeles Mirror-News, Brown is quoted as saying, "Six governors and four leaders from populous states have urged me to ask Senator Symington to accept the second spot. These governors include Michael DiSalle of Ohio."

The same paper also quoted Symington as asserting, "I am interested in the presidency.

Speaker Rayburn has been in constant touch with Truman since arriving in Los Angeles. Rayburn talked to him by phone several tim-



es Tuesday. Rep. Lenore Sullivan, Mo., a member of her state's delegation, is saying privately that "more than 75 per cent of our group will switch to Johnson on the second ballot."

Meanwhile, Sen. Hubert H u mphrey is planning to declare for Steverison today.

Yesterday, Minnesota's Gov. Orville Freeman announced he will vote for Kennedy. Sen. Eugene Mc-Carthy, Minn., previously had come out for Johnson.

Humphrey is explaining his swing to Stevenson as a maneuver to further Freeman's chances for the vice presidency. Humphrey believes he will be in a stronger "bargaining position" to press Freeman's chances.

DR. HAROLD T. HYMAN

If you're planning a summer campaign to get rid of some of that blubber you took on over the winter, I've a few words of caution.

Don't diet too strenuously. After a few days of living almost exclusively on your own fat you'll begin feeling weak, irritable and perhaps headachy. The reason: unless a certain amount of sugars and starches are consumed while fat is being burned, an acidosis may develop, Don't lose too much weight too rapidly.

The reason: you're apt to look too scrawny if you don't give your tissues a chance to adapt hemselves to your new propor-

Don't place too great reliance on drugs.

The effects of safe doses of appetite-killers are primarily in your mind. The effects of larger doses may include harmful side reactions like nervousness, restlessness, sleeplessness, and palpitation from speeding of your heart rate (tachycardia)

If then you begin taking tranquilizers or sedatives to calm yourself during the day, and sleeping medicines to offset nocturnal insomnia, you're just asking for trouble. By the same token, if you over-

dose with thyroid, you're no wiser than the motorist who races along the highway in a rattling

And if you think you can get the most weight loss with the least by - effects by swallowing a shotgun preparation that combines appetite- killer, thyroid, tranquilizer and sedative, you're behaving like the aforementioned motorist who after being warned, tries speeding with his brakes set. .

Finally, if you're succeeding too well (losing too rapidly, losing on a diet that's not particularly low in colories or losing on a diet that didn't work once before), better make sure you're not suffering from some wasting disturbance: sugar sickness (diabetes mellitus.) hyperthyroldism
