What do they buy on installment plans? Automobiles, furniure, household appliances and ther goods and services.

Consumer installment credit also makes loans available for reair and modernization of homes, and includes personal loans for family and individual needs. It loes not include single - payment loans or charge accounts.

Although installment credit dates back several thousand years, modern consumer bank installment credit is only celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. Various forms of deferred payments appeared in the United States during the 1800s - in the selling of furniture, sewing machines, pianos and books.

The idea of banks lending money to individuals on the basis of character and income, to be repaid in monthly installments, did not exist until the early 1900s.

In 1910, Arthur J. Morris opened his first bank, Fidelity Savings and Trust Co., to provide character-and-income loans to be repaid in regular installments at a rea-

sonable rate of interest. Today most of the country's banks, as well as other financial institutions and retail establishments, provide consumer installment credit. Many of the largest companies, as well as small businesses, depend, to a large extent, upon installment credit in the selling of their products and services.

Consumer installment credit to \$39,482,000,000 at the start of 1960 The average amount of installment credit outstanding in 1959 was \$195 per capita.

Banks provide the largest share of installment credit - currently about \$15 billion, Sales finance companies, retail outlets, consu mer finance firms and credit unions follow in that order.

The auto industry depends heavily upon installment credit. It is estimated the 29 million of the 43.4 million individually - owned passenger cars in the United States were bought on credit.

This year along some 10 million new and used cars are expected to be purchased on credit-4.4 million new cars and 5.6 million used

Automobile loans represent the largest single type of installment credit, followed by personal loans, other consumer goods and home repair and modernization.

Families in the middle-income group are the main users of installment credit - particularly those in the \$6,000 to \$7,500 income bracket.

1,698 Countians Receive Benefits

Gray County residents were receiving monthly payments totaling \$1,237,992 from Social Security benefits at the end of 1959, the Amarillo Social Security office announced.

ASKS MEMORIAL FUNDS WASHINGTON (UPI) - Sen Hiram L. Fong, R-Hawaii, has called for Senate action on his bill proposing \$200,000 for construction of a USS Arizona memorial at Pearl Harbor.

Fong, in a letter to the Senate Armed Services Committee Monday, said Hawaii had appropriated \$50,000 for the memorial, and approximately \$250,000 was raised through private subscriptions. He said another \$200,000 was needed to prevent the battleship from 'visibly eroding from the ravages of time and water."

The Arizona was sunk during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941.



While an observant member of a household with suggestions from an experienced housewife, can usually figure out the why and wherefore of appetite whims, there are some occasions when medical consultation is required. For example, it's bad judgment

to rely wholly on self-diagnosis and home treatment if appetite loss (anorexia) continues for more than a few days without obvious explanation. if, as a result of anorexia, there is spid or slowly progressive loss in weight, have a checkup.

dous increase in appetite (bulimia) also may require professional attention. Exemplifying this, a ravenous appetité that simply cannot be appeased may be an early man:-

festation of the sugar sickness (diabetes mellitus). Hunger that comes on between meals or at bedtime, or that wakens a person from sleep, may be occasioned by an ulcer of the stomach or the first portion of

the small intestine (duodenum).

Sometimes, great hunger is accompanied by tremendous thirst (polydipsia). When great hunger and thirst are combined it's almost a sure sign of diabetes, especially if there's no gain in weight proportionate to the amount of food and drink that's consumed. The combination of all three

symptoms (bulimia, polydipsia and failure to gain, or loss of, weight) demands immediate medical consultation since delay may lead to severe complications. especially diabetic acidosis and The last of the appetite disturbances to which I want to

direct your attention, usually a child or a disturbed adult, develops a craving (pica) for some strange substance like wa ipaper, plaster, crayons or the enamel paint of a crib. Indeed, before manufacturers omitted lead from articles han-

dled by children, lead poisoning was frequently encountered in youngsters who couldn't resist a diet of crayons and the ename! of their cribs. While pica is usually a passing phase of no importance in the

developing child, it's a sign that requires investigation when it appears in the adult. I hope you never see it in any of the grownups in your household. But if it turns up, better arrange for a visit to your doctor.


