BE ALERT TO FALSE CLAIMS OF SINUS CURE DEVICES By DR. HAROLD T. HYMAN

Q - How good are household air purifiers for the treatment of sinus troubles with asthma that my doctor thinks may be due to dust?

A - The Food and Drug Administration has just obtained a ruling on two types of device 'contained small air filters with electric fans to circulate the air and ultraviolet lamps capable of producing a small amount of ozone gas.'

Experiments conducted by the agency showed that "such devices have no significant effect in ridding the air of contaminants and dust and will afford no relief to sufferers of asthma, hay fever, altergies and sinus conditions." As a result of these experiments, the court issued a decree in which it ordered destruction of

From Europe come rumors that President Kennedy's emissaries to Moscow are preparing the way for another summit conference, with Berlin as the main topic on the agenda. Recently there have been discussions in Moscow between our Ambassador Thompson and Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko, also talks in Washington between Dean Rusk and Soviet Ambassador Menshikov, reportedly in connection with the Berlin situation. Stripped of the diplomatic ambiguity and abracadabra with which such news releases are garnished, they mean precisely nothing.

Sources in England and West Germany, both vitally concerned with the German question, do not regard Berlin as the prime objective for which Khrushchev is angling. Berlin is but a pawn in his political game for the obvious purpose of welding the eastern part of Germany onto the Soviet satellites of Poland and Czech-

slovakia that border that part of eastern Europe. It would extend the Russian empire into the very heart of Europe, from which penetration farther to the west, would be relatively simple.

The often repeated proposal of the Soviet that Berlin, both East and West be merged into what Khrushchev refers to as a "free city" would mean a demilitarized and neutral island deep in the red sea of communist influence. The city would then be the center of Soviet espionage and subver-

sion, only the eastern part of which is presently given over largely to such activities. The police of West Berlin are constantly discovering the manner in which the diplomatic corps of the satellites abuse their privileges by carrying on in West Berlin the
