Home Builders Are Old-Fashioned Lot

HAWTHORNE, N. Y. (NEA) — There's nothing wrong with the chronically ill home building industry — that a little progress, automation, invention, imagination, education and research couldn't cure.

That's the opinion of Joshua Benanav, a youthful Czechoslovakian refugee who went into the field here as a home "manufacturer" rather than as a home builder.

Many builders may take sharp exception to Benanav's views. The few "little things" that Benanav believes need correcting before home building is put on a solid ground include:

1. Building methods. "A Revolutionary War farmer would see modern advances everywhere today until he would observe a man on top of a hill building a house. Then he would feel right at home because the builder would generally be using the same techniques he can live from house to house, never knowing how much anything costs, but taking out enough to get by until the next house or development comes along. So he has no time for money and research."

Benanav's (Seaboard Homes) firm pioneers a research program in which few experiments are tried in individual houses. The houses are sold in the open market to test customer reaction.

2. Slums. "These are more abundant today than ever before here, because the cost squeeze keeps more people in deteriorating neighborhoods or forces them from one to the other. Even though their incomes go up, housing costs stay ahead, because there has been little attempt to save on labor or overhead."
3. Style. "The trouble with well-styled homes built out of the usual materials is that they cost too much. The trouble with some prefabricated homes is that style is forgotten about entirely; any box is called a home."
4. The builders themselves. "You know what it takes to be a builder? No schooling, of course, even though every other field, including barbering, demands it. No, all that is needed is a few dollars (not thousands, or even hundreds) and a lot of guts."

"Then, as long as he is building, and materials employed in the farmer's day."

2. Employment. "Automation has come to every field — except the home building industry. I had to invent my own machinery to cut wood on an automated basis. Of course, it now cut it better, cheaper and faster."

"With much of the manufacturing done away from the land site, construction can go on all year instead of shutting down for the winter."

3. Style. "The trouble with well-styled homes built out of the usual materials is that they cost too much. The trouble with some prefabricated homes is that style is forgotten about entirely; any box is called a home."

"Combine the best techniques of both, manufacturing the wood sections to save money, handworking in stone and brick, if necessary, to maintain quality."

Fortunately, many prefabricators already have adapted this policy and turn out attractive homes.

As Benanav sees it, home builders grudgingly give into style changes, "unlike the auto industry where the manufacturers set the styles."

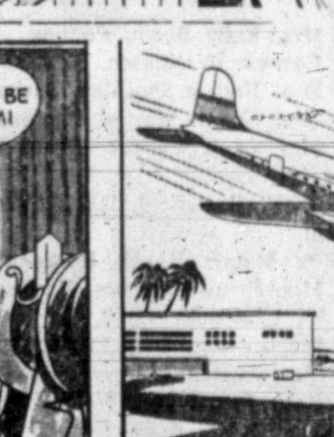

A lot of things are preached as Gospel truths to-day. You have the perfect right to ask, "What is the gospel?" Galatians 1:8 Paul said though we or an angel from heaven preach any other gospel than that we have preached, let him be accursed. ABOUT THE CLEAREST DEFINITION OF THE GOSPEL IS FOUND IN 1 CORINTHIANS 15:3-8 How that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures And that he was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the scriptures in Romans 10:9-10 Paul says, that if, thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and believe in thine heart that God hath raised Him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. The Brumel-Thomas duel again is expected to attract a capacity crowd of 16,000 to the Garden. Brumel outjumped Long John, 7-3 to 7-1, in the New York A. C. games two weeks ago and then beat Thomas in the Nationals last week, 7-2 to 7-0.

Lester Honorable Mention Brains, Brawn Head Class A All-Staters

Three members of the 1961 Texas Sports Writers Association Class A all-state schoolboy basketball team are also on the basketball floor.

The association's Class A all-state committee headed by James Norman of the Abilene Reporter-News came up with a five-man crew standing 6-2 or better and with at least three of them as astute students as they are players.

Freddie Bates, a slender, 6-7, 170-pounder from London in deep East Texas with a 901 grade average, led in the balloting for the all-senior mythical team by polling 46 of a possible 85 points.

Rounding out the first team were Frank Walker of Three Rivers, whose book grades topped the list with a fancy 97 average; Preston Johnson, an A student from Thrall; Billy Uzell of Eagle Lake, and Leon Vasek of Moulton.

The voting varied but slightly for the other four with Uzell polling 30 points, Vasek 28, Walker 27 and Johnson 26.

Johnson barely nosed out Lloyd who headed up a seven-man second team. Joining Kirkham on the second unit were Jack Meixner of Plains, Gary Carpenter of Crowell, David Stiles of Midlothian, Edward

Rpeves' of Coahoma, Johnny Cole of Fairfield and Doyle Sturman of Gruver, the latter the only junior on either team.

Kirkham polled 24 points and Meixner 19 with the other five getting 18 points each.

Bates was rated a terrific rebounder to go along with a 23.1-point scoring average in his third season as a London regular. He also won third place in the high jump in the 1959 state meet.

Uzell, who along with Johnson is up from the all-state honorable mention list of a year ago, is a four-year letterman at Eagle Lake and owns the team's top scoring average of 27 points per game. The 185-pound, 6-3 Eagle ace has twice made all-district in both basketball and football.

Vasek, a 6-2, 185-pounder, averaged 22 rebounds per game for Moulton and was rated one of the top boys in Central Texas. He averaged 20.3 for the season and 21.7 in district play. He has made the all-tourney team in all nine of the tournaments in which he's competed for three years.

Tommy Lester, White Deer guard, was the only Buck to make honorable mention on the 1961 Class A team. Leading scorer on White Deer's state entrant, Lester is a senior.

Art Heyman of Duke has been reinstated to the good graces of the Atlantic Coast Conference, and now the star sophomore from New York is taking it upon himself to mete out his own brand of punishment to the member schools.

Heyman, suspended for several league games by the ACC following a brawl in the North Carolina contest last month, scored 22 points Thursday in leading the Blue Devils to a 89-84 romp over Virginia in a first-round game of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament. Duke is expected to have an easy time against South Carolina today in the semi-finals round.

In other first-round ACC contests, South Carolina upset North Carolina State, 89-78; and Maryland toppled Clemson, 91-75. The Southern Conference also

started its annual tournament Thursday with favored West Virginia whipping Virginia Military Institute, 89-71; George Washington upsetting second-ranked Virginia Tech, 84-83; William & Mary edging Furman, 86-84, in a triple overtime; and The Citadel eliminating Richmond, 70-66.

On other fronts, Texas Tech whipped Texas, 63-60; to clinch its first Southwest Conference basketball crown and a berth in the NCAA tournament and Georgetown crushed New York University, 92-69, to eliminate any chance the Violets had of earning a bid to the National Invitation Tournament.

The Duke winning margin over Virginia accounted for the most one-sided victory in the history of the ACC tournament. Eleven different players got into the scoring column for the Blue Devils, who used their second stringers for most of the final half.

South Carolina pulled the biggest surprise of the opening round as the Wolfpack were considered a prime contender for the title. The lead changed hands 18 times and the score was tied on 15 occasions but South Carolina finally went ahead for good on a pair of foul shots in the final minutes of play.

In the other semifinal match to

day, Maryland faces Wake Forest, which had a first-round bye. Mountaineers were led in scoring by Lee Patrone with 29 points. West Virginia, a heavy favorite to capture its seventh consecutive Southern Conference title and the NCAA berth that goes with it, posed it on in the second half. Citadel.

Aw, Why Don't They:

Let Shakespeare Alone

NEW YORK (NEA)—Hold everything. A detective here named Calvin Hoffman just back from England says he finally has proof positive that the coroner's report was phoned and the murder was never committed.

If he can make the proof stick, Hoffman may have the vital evidence to show that the literary works of William Shakespeare were not written by William Shakespeare at all, but by another man using the same name.

Hoffman's finding: that poet-playwright Christopher Marlowe was not murdered in 1593, giving him the opportunity to have been "Shakespeare."

Hoffman says Marlowe had everything else.

Now, the actual authorship of those plays and poetry may seem

from the education, known works and verified experience to the pressing need for a pen name.

A brilliant, influential, rebellious writer, Marlowe made enemies. Accused of atheism and with a death sentence facing him, he had to plot his own murder and flee under the disguise it gave him.

To earn his living in exile, Hoffman reasons, he wrote. Friends back in England had his works published and produced, paying an actor named William Shakespeare to claim the authorship.

Hoffman's case has already convinced thousands of people. And the biggest hole in his theory—Marlowe's murder at the age of 30, shortly before Shakespeare's works began to appear—seems now to be plugged up.

Unhappily, another hole opens. Hoffman has no way of knowing when Marlowe died—if he died at all. And that could make him 298 years old today.

Plant Blast Kills 2

Injures 32

BATON ROUGE, La. (UPI)—Crews moved into the blast-torn area of the Ethyl Corp. petrochemical plant here today, searching for the cause of explosions that killed two workers and injured 32 others Thursday.

Four of the injured were hospitalized with critical burns. Three others were also hospitalized, and 25 received lesser injuries in the series of explosions.

The blasts ripped one of the six red brick structures where most of the U.S. supply of tetraethyl lead, the "antiknock" gasoline additive, is produced. About half of Ethyl's 2,800 employees were at the plant when the explosions occurred during the morning.

The plant also manufactures high quantities of ethyl chloride and other compounds of steadily chlorine gas. A nearby school was cleared before it was learned the chlorine unit of the plant was not damaged.

Rodeo And Horse Show At McLean To Start May 31

MCLEAN (SpI)—May 31 has been selected as the starting date for McLean's annual four-day 66 Rodeo and Horse Show.

John C. Haynes, McLean mayor and president of the 66 Roundup and Rodeo Association, announced that the affair—which each year attracts hundreds of persons from throughout the Panhandle—will run through June 3.

Rodeo events are scheduled daily with the horse show closing the celebration.

Additional construction work will begin soon at the rodeo grounds northwest of the city on SH 273. A new arena and stock pens were erected last year.

Haynes said plans call for the construction of bleachers on the east side of the arena similar to those now located on the west side. Two rest rooms and a concession stand also are to be built.

Truitt Johnson is chairman of the building committee.

Faris Hess is in charge of the trail ride committee. Last year a group of local and area residents rode horses along U.S. 66 to Amarillo to publicize the Rodeo and Horse Show.

Working Rest In Florida For Mrs. Kennedy

PALM BEACH, Fla. (UPI)—Mrs. John F. Kennedy began a "working rest" in sunny Florida yesterday planning her search for antique furniture for the White House and hoping to recuperate from an attack of bronchitis.

Mrs. Kennedy arrived Wednesday aboard a regular commercial airline flight after an unannounced departure from Washington. Her hostess was Mrs. Charles Wrightman, a close friend and member of the First Lady's Fine Arts Committee for the White House.

In Washington, White House Press Secretary Pierre Salinger said Mrs. Kennedy planned to spend six or seven days at Palm Beach. He said he knew of no plan for the President to join her.

Survey Ordered For Perryton Hospital Needs

PERRYTON (SpI)—A special hospital committee has been named by Lester Baumann, president of the Chamber of Commerce, to make a study of Perryton's hospital needs and make recommendations.

Harold Hudson has been named chairman of the committee, with Drew Ellis, Giltner LaMaster, Bob Queener, Jack M. Allen, Gene Steed, J. W. Erickson and Irvin Buchanan as members.

It is planned to use information compiled in the Industrial Facts Book, the Perryton School survey made last year, a private hospital survey made in 1960, plus trips to other cities to visit county and city hospitals.

Following this study, a report will be compiled and presented with recommendations to the commissioners court, with a possibility of a bond election being asked to finance construction of a hospital.

It is hoped that the survey can be completed within 30 days, Hudson said.

Court Refuses To Change Order On Property Law

AUSTIN (UPI)—The State Supreme Court has refused to change its stand that community property laws take precedence over survivorship statutes when a woman's husband dies.

The court found no reason to grant Pearl Hilley a rehearing of a ruling that she share stock purchased in her name and that of her husband with her son.

When W. E. Hilley died, his wife Pearl contended in a McLennan County case that the stock in joint ownership should go to her.

But a trial court and the civil appeals court in Waco both agreed it was community property and Hilley's son by a previous marriage, Garland Hilley, was entitled to a share of it.

The Supreme Court said in a ruling Jan. 25 that even joint ownership becomes vested in heirs or legal representatives and does not survive exclusively to the joint owner or owners.

The case was termed part of the state's "most important current legal problems" by Jack W. Ledbetter, a University of Texas professor of business law.

Twelve Men Now In School Race At Perryton

PERRYTON (SpI)—Twelve men have now entered the race for the three vacancies on the Perryton School Board.

Kenneth Stone, salesman, added his name to the list Tuesday bringing the total number of candidates to an even dozen.

Also filing this week were Harold Malone, Bob Queener, Jim Anderson and Vernon Hergert. Already in the race were Warren Cudd, Joe Erickson, John Hardy, Harold Simpson, Bruce Holmes, Norman Swink and Marvin Montgomery.

Simpson is the only one of the three incumbents to file, with Dear McCutcheon and C. H. Williams not planning to seek re-election.

Company Formed To Aid Drivers

State Farm agent Jim Still said today the newly organized State Farm County Mutual Insurance Company of Texas has been organized to help drivers who now have difficulty getting auto insurance.

Single men under 25, men and women over 65, and motorists whose records are generally satisfactory are affected by the new program, which becomes effective in Texas immediately. Still said it is the first move of its kind in Texas.
