77 Die In Plane Disaster Hits Peak

AGANA, Guam (UPI) - A four-engine transport plane carrying U.S. servicemen and civilians home to America flew into the jungled side of Mt. Barrigada at dawn today carrying 77 persons to their deaths. There were 17

There were reports that the plane, a DC6B chartered by the Military Air Transport Service from World Airways, exploded in flight but there was no official confirmation.

A smooth-working rescue team brought the survivors by helicopter to the U.S. Naval Hospital in

Three were in critical condition, four in serious condition and the

rest listed as fair. Some of the passengers apparently were not killed immediately in the crash but were trapped and burned to death before res-

cuers could reach them. Rescue workers said they had recovered 71 bodies. The other six were listed officially as "missing" but there was no hope of finding them alive. "The bodies of the victims were so badly burned that identification will be diffi-
