



STATEMENT BY JOHN TOWER ON BASIC CAMPAIGN ISSUES



SELF-GOVERNMENT - I believe in the principles of Thomas Jefferson, "that government is best which governs least," providing every American with the opportunity to manage his own affairs.

STATES' RIGHTS - I believe in a federation of states as the Constitution of the United States intended and not in a highly centralized bureaucracy in Washington.

FEDERAL ECONOMY - I believe that in order to achieve stability of the dollar, the federal government must live within its means, recognizing the basic fact that stewardship of the people's tax dollars is a sacred trust.

LABOR, MINIMUM WAGE, AND FEPC - 1

believe that Texans must maintain its right-to-work laws, which offer the individual freedom of choice in joining a labor union. I am vigorously opposed to the New Frontier pledge to repeal such laws and destroy that freedom, I am also opposed to any extension of the minimum wage laws and to a Fair Employment Practices Commission which would remove from employers the right to select their own personnel.
