THE UNION MONOPOLISTS The nationwide shipping strike paralyzed American ocean going commerce at every Atlantic, Gulf and Pacific port in a terrible demonstration of the union hold on the U.S. economy. Fortunately, through the wis-

dom of conservatives in Congress in 1947, the U.S. government had the Taft - Hartley law with which to deal with the strike. This is the law that union bosses termed a "slave labor law." In truth, however, Taft-Hartley has been used on 18 occasions to prevent subjection of the American people to rule by union bosses. Pres. Kennedy voted against Taft - Hartley when he was in

Congress. He deplored the fact that he had to use it this year. All of which is very regrettable, for without Taft-Hartley the nation's economy today would be under the heel of Joe Curran. president of the National Maritime Union, and other ruthless leaders of the five striking mari-

There is something to deplore about Taft-Hartley, but it is not what Mr. Kennedy had in mind. What is to be deplored is the fact that it is not more far-reaching in getting at the union power that holds back the American economy and so often disrupts it in fantastically costly manner as in the shipping strike. Actually, the shipping strike is

a reminder that a must item of business for this country is a breakup of the biggest and most dangerous monopoly in the United States - the union monopoly. The antitrust laws must be applied to all alike if we are to have a free country. The arrogance of the union

bossses knows no bounds. The maritime unions even rejected the bargaining agreement proposed by Secretary of Labor Goldberg himself a former union official. The shipping companies had agreed to accept the Goldberg plan as a basis for negotiation. But the union overlords weren't willing even to consider half a loaf; they wanted the whole loaf or nothing. Ultimate aim of the unionists is total domination of all labor activities in the United States so that they can call a general strike. This aim was candidly admitted last year by Jimmy Hoffa, boss of he scandal - ridden Teamsters Union, who so arrogantly breathed his defiance of the federal government at his Miami meet-

If the United States is not to be permanently exposed to nationwide strikes that hurt its economy, if the individual working man is to regain rights now stripped from him by a handful of union autocrats who have squads of goons at their command, the labor monopoly must be broken. In fact, the nationwide strike as an instrument of union power must be surrendered. It is not right, it is not American, it is a travesty on freedom for the 15 million members of union of this group - to hold the welfare of the other 165 million people of this country in its

It is clear, however, that no progress will be made on this important national goal so long as the present administration is in power. The Kennedy administration is too busy witch-hunting among American free enterprise to deal with the union monopolists who are endangering the economy. The New Frontiersmen are aiming to weaken and break up American companies that are symbols of technical progress and better living the world over. Companies that have the skill to make the weapons we need for national defense and for full production are being blackmailed into accepting consent decrees, threatened with anti-trust prosecution.

The attack on private enterprise is under way. Meanwhile, the union bosses shake their fists in the faces of the American people. And Mr. Kennedy deplores the fact that he has to use a Taft-Hartley injunction. Undoubtedly millions of Americans deplore the fact that their government won't go after the union bosses who want to impose tyranny on the cities and commerce of this country. They should tell their Congressmen so.

TULSA, Okla, (UPI)-Alcohol-27,000 barrels of it - is being pumped into a Pennsylvania oil field in an effort to produce oil which waterflooding failed to move to the surface.

South Penn Oil Co. hopes alcohol will do for stubborn Pennsylvania oil formations what liquefied gas mixtures have done for depleted fields in the southwest and mid-continent areas.

Alcohol, like the propane butane mixtures used in the Southwest, mixes with both oil and water. For that reason it is considered as a possible subtitute for liquefied gas not economically available in Pennsylva nia and adjacent areas.

The alcohol experiment is reported in "The Independent," a monthly magazine of the Independent Petroleum Association of America.

The Ouaker state experiment in the Bradford area follows a great deal of research by Pennsylvania University.

The experiment is designed to find out whether an alcohol "slug" followed by water can produce oil with the same efficiency that southwestern operators have gained by injecting propane followed by natural gas.

There is the cost question, too alcohol is being bought at \$10.50 per barrel from Enjay Co., a Humble division, at Baton Rouge, La. Tower In Favor Of Armed Force Going Into Cuba

MEDFORD, Ore. (UPI) - U.S. Sen. John Tower, R-Tex., said Mrs. Ruth Maglaughlin, 2201 N. Saturday he favored a U. S. Mili- Nelson tary invasion of Cuba and said it appears that the "time will come" when America must do so.

Tower said he expects such action because Cuba is now a "staging area" for invasion of other Latin American countries.

He said Castro "intends to have Latin America" and the United States must use "whatever means it needs" to prevent this.

The 35-year-old Texas conserva tive addressed about 400 Republicans at a fund-raising breakfast here.

Tower declared that the West must not yield West Berlin "with out a fight." But he added that "if we demonstrate we are willing to fight, we will not have to fight."

Tower said the Kennedy administration has begun to exert itself but he added the Russians must be told that America will use its military might if the Soviets "enroach on one more inch of free territory."

Tower said the West Must stand firm on Berlin because Berlin has become a symbol to free and uncommitted nations.

Tower criticized the Democrats, saying their "appeal of cradle-tothe-grave security," dependent on the federal government, weakened moral fibre.


