# Astronaut Hits 118-Mile Peak In 16-Minute Trip; Disaster Averted At Sea

CAPE CANAVERAL (UPI) - Virgil I. Gus Grissom leaped 118 miles into the sky to become America's second spaceman today in a 16-minute rocket flight which ended in loss of his spacecraft and near disaster for him. Grisom had to blow the hatch off of his capsule and swim 65 to 75 feet before he

KEEP THE FIRE BURNING "And the Angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush, and he looked and behold the bush burned with fire, and the bush was not consumed. Exodus 3;2


It is a wonderful thing when the life of a man is lived in a way that causes others to believe in God and live for Him. The life of Moses was such a man. He was a blessing to his people, his Nation, and his God. Mosesdared to live a Godly life in an ungodly world.

There are many scenes in the life of Moses to which we could turn for inspiration and challenge. We see him as a beautiful baby. One whose life was miraculously saved by the providential hand of God. We are challenged by the courageous decision of his heart in the days of his youth. "By faith Moses, when he was come to years refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter. Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season. Heb. 11; 24-25. We could well consider his forty years of preparation. His forty years of leadership in leading the people of Israel out of the Egyptian bondage and wilderness. His experience on Mount Sinia, and many others. But we turn to his experience at the burning bush for our meditation.

There were two significant experiences that came to Moses as he watched the bush burn and yet it was not consumed by fire. First, Moses received the Divine Call of God to bring deliverance to His people. Secondly, he saw what God wanted his life to be like. God showed Moses that He wanted his life to be like the burning bush. Keep on fire for God. There were many hard roads to travel and trying experiences lying ahead. There was the long wilderness through which Moses must journey with a discouraged and complaining people. Often times they would bow down and worship false gods and even curse God and Moses. But God was telling Moses he must not lose his faith, and enthusiasm, and courage. He must continue to let the light of God shine through his life or the people would perish in darkness and sin. Moses kept the light shiring. "And the Children of Israel saw the face of Moses that the skin of Mose's face shone." Exodus 34:35

One of the greatest dangers we face today as Christian people is letting the fire go out. So often we begin our Christian life with enthusiasm and joy and courage. We are happy. We have a burning desire in our hearts that others will be saved and come to know the abundant way of life. It was this heart-warming experience that John Wesley had that caused him to go out into the high-ways and by-ways and win thousands of lost people to Christ. We live in a cold and sinful world spiritually speaking and we can be sure the devil is going to do all in his power to put the fire out. It is easy to see others taking it easy and to feel it is alright for us to only half-heartedly serve God and the church. There is the danger of drifting with the world and letting our lamps go out as did the five foolish Virgins.

God wants His people to do as Moses. Keep the fire burning. Let the light of Christ shine. Never lose your enthusiasm and joy, your faith and courage. Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in Heaven." Matt. 5;16






