

Rusty Old Cuban Tanker Is Sold To Settle Liens

CORPUS CHRISTI (UPI). — A New York City firm purchased a small, rusty old Cuban tanker put on the auction block Wednesday by the federal government because Fidel Castro refused to pay bills on it.

The firm of Hughes Bros. Inc., bought the "Mar Caribe" for \$121,000. The money will be used to satisfy liens of a number of United States companies against the ship for repairs and dock fees.

The tanker was impounded in the port of Corpus Christi on Dec. 27, 1960 by a federal district court. Cuba sent representatives to the United States to try and get the ship released on grounds that the ship actually belongs to the Cuban government.

After a long legal battle, the court ordered James W. McCarthy of Houston, chief U. S. marshal for the southern district of Texas, to sell the ship at an auction and turn proceeds over to the court for distribution to firms with claims against it.

British Host U.S. Track Stars Today

LONDON (UPI)—The United States track and field team has a list of injuries a yard long, but even so, Uncle Sam's touring squad was expected to win its third straight meet when it takes on Great Britain today and Saturday at White City Stadium.

"We have an unusual list of injuries, far more than our share, in fact," said coach Jim Elliott, whose charges enter today's meet following back-to-back victories over the Soviet Union in Moscow and West Germany in Stuttgart.

A separate women's meet between the United States and Great Britain also will be held. There is some concern about the condition of Wilma Rudolph, the Tennessee State sensation who set a world record of 11.2 seconds for the 100 meters against West Germany but suffered a leg sprain.

Patterson's Stand Irks Promoter

NEW YORK (UPI)—Promoter George Parnassus of Los Angeles said today, "I believe Floyd Patterson is letting half the heavyweight crown slip right off his head by ignoring my \$500,000 offer for a defense against Alejandro Lavorante at the Los Angeles Coliseum."

Parnassus, best known fight promoter on the Pacific Coast, explained, "Because neither Patterson nor his handlers will even consider my legitimate offer for a defense against one of the top six contenders, I'll have to demand that the National Boxing Association vacate his crown."

At his hotel in New York, Parnassus recalled he had been trying to get Patterson to accept Lavorante of Argentina as challenger since last May 11 when Alejandro knocked out Zora Foley, who was second-ranking contender at that time.

Texans Lead Milwaukee Golf Meet

MILWAUKEE (UPI)—Veteran Fred Hawkins and young Don Massengale, a pair of "hungry Texans," led the field with five-under-par 65's today at the start of the second round of the 72-hole, \$30,000 Milwaukee Open golf tournament.

Hawkins, 37, El Paso, a consistent money-winner in previous years, shot a 20-35 and needed every bit of his front nine showing to tie Massengale, who finished with him with a flourish, getting birdies on the last three holes in Thursday's round.

Massengale, 24, Jacksboro, a former Texas Christian University star, who won the Texas State Amateur tournament and Southwest conference championship in 1958, traveled the 6,410-yard North Hills Country Club course in nine holes of 31 and 34.

Hawkins, a 15-year veteran, who usually wins about \$22,000 a year, has only earned about \$4,500 this year. Massengale, in his second year as a pro, has only earned about \$1,700 this year.

Jack Cupit, 23, Longview, Tex., the rookie professional sensation, who won last weekend's Canadian open, turned in a first round 66 to tie with Tommy Veech, 32, Milwaukee, who was playing his home course.

Bunched at 67 were Tommy Bolt, Crystal River, Fla., amateur Jack Nicklaus, 21, Columbus, Ohio; Paul Harney, Worcester, Mass., and Stan Leonard, Vancouver, B.C.

Twenty-one players including two amateurs also broke the par-70 course mark.

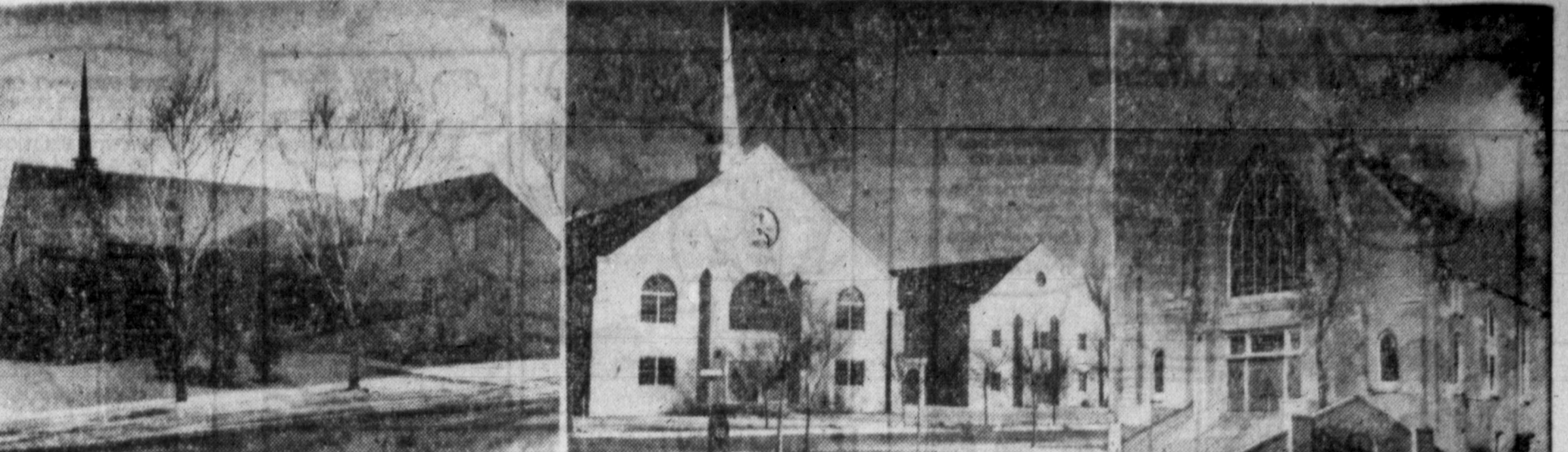
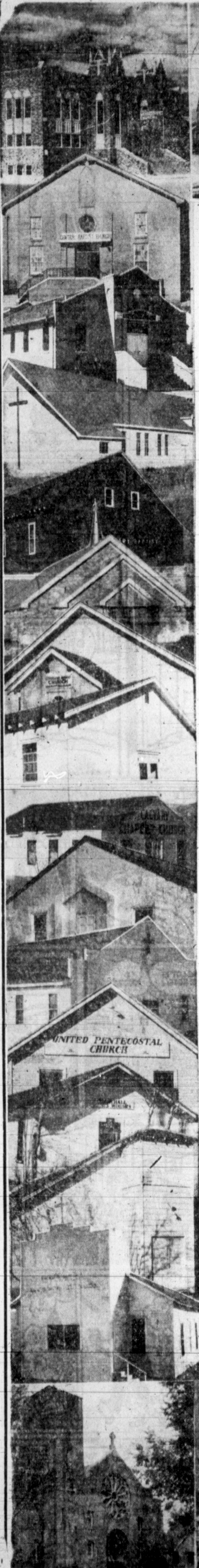

Moses kept the light shining. "And the Children of Israel saw the face of Moses that the skin of Moses' face shone." Exodus 34:35

One of the greatest dangers we face today as Christian people is letting the fire go out. So often we begin our Christian life with enthusiasm and joy and courage. We are happy. We have a burning desire in our hearts that others will be saved and come to know the abundant way of life. It was this heart-warming experience that John Wesley had that caused him to go out into the high-ways and by-ways and win thousands of lost people to Christ. We live in a cold and sinful world spiritually speaking and we can be sure the devil is going to do all in his power to put the fire out. It is easy to see others taking it easy and to feel it is alright for us to only half-heartedly serve God and the church. There is the danger of drifting with the world and letting our lamps go out as did the five foolish Virgins.

God wants His people to do as Moses. Keep the fire burning. Let the light of Christ shine. Never lose your enthusiasm and joy, your faith and courage. Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in Heaven." Matt. 5:16

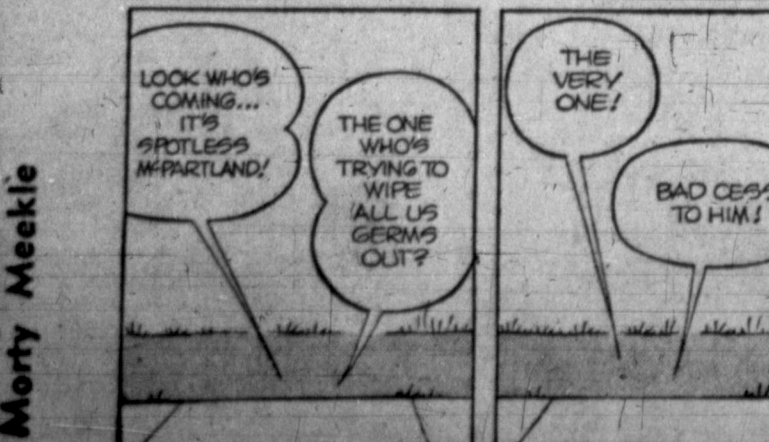
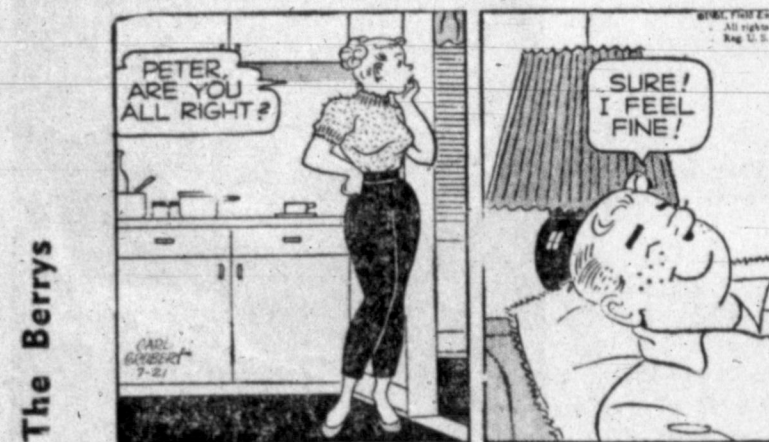
