

The Atomic Energy Commission said today the Los Angeles firm of Holmes and Nazver had a contract for construction on the island. This followed reports that skilled workmen were being recruited in Hawail to be sent to Johnston Island within a month,

Defense sources confirmed the work would be part of the Defense Department's preparations for atmospheric testing. The Los Angeles firm did the preliminary construction for previous tests at Eniwetok in the Marshall Islands,

The Defense Department announced Dec. 29 that Maj. Gen. Alfred D. Starbirk had been named to head a task force which would be ready to carry out nuclear tests in the air if President Kennedy orders them.
