MAKASSAR, Indonesia (UPI) - President Sukarno escaped a third attempt against his life when a hand grenade exploded Sunday night in a crowd outside a sports arena, killing 3 persons and injuring 28.

The 60-year-old president, unhurt but obviously edgy after the explosion, went on with his speech in the arena and ripped into The Netherlands for its refusal to hand West Irian in West New Guinea over to Indonesia.
