21st Century Allegro Club Has Film Illustrating "Communist Cancer"

Twentieth Century Allegro met Tuesday afternoon in the home of Mrs. John Gentry, 1500 N. W. 22, with Mrs. Charles Walsh as co-hostess.

Mrs. J. R. Reeve, program chairman, played an album recorded by Dr. Walter H. Judd, entitled "Communist Cancer."

The address presented in the album was delivered and recorded at a convention of business men held at Purdue University.

"Many sophisticated anti-communists consider this the clearest and most logical spelling-out of the communist menace extant," Mrs. Reeve explained. Vividly incontrovertible, it diagnoses the disease of Soviet Imperialism, then recommends emergency surgery you will have to help perform if this planet can be saved from the malignancy.

"Walter Judd received his Fellowship in Surgery at the Mayo Clinic in 1932. Two years later, he returned to Asia, this time to North China. He survived a Communist revolution and the Japanese invasion. He became a candidate for Congress from the Minnesota Fifth District. Elected in 1942, he has been re-elected every two years. He is a member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs and has served as delegate to the General Assembly of the United Nations."

"Mr. Judd has authored numerous legislative bills of vast impact, including The United States-Philippine Mutual Security Act, Public Law 486 which has greatly increased the use abroad of American surplus farm products; the legislation leading to The Pacific Pact (now SEATO); and has been sent to Europe seven times and to the Far East six times to observe, analyze and report to Congress and executive branch."

Beefed-Up Math Program Planned For Texas A & M

COLLEGE STATION (UPI) — A beefed-up mathematics program, designed to better prepare future engineers to face higher demands of the space age, will begin at Texas A&M next semester.

Freshmen students entering the engineering school in September will be required to take courses in analytical geometry and calculus. The subjects previously were sophomore-year courses.

Dean Fred Benson said high school students applying for the engineering school should have a knowledge of algebra and trigonometry. If not, they can take a special six-week summer school course to prepare them for the advanced math.

"Today, the demands for both the general and technical education of a professional engineer requires an earlier understanding of advanced math courses," Benson said.

He said engineering schools across the country have been strengthening their math courses, and Texas A&M is going along with them. Benson added that more math is necessary because of the "increasing demands made upon today's engineers."

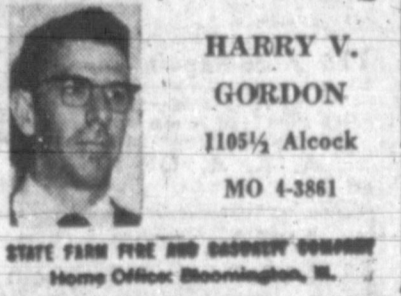
