UNITED NATIONS (UPI) -The Soviet Union sought today to bring its troika rule in the back door of the United 'Nations, The United States barred the way.

Informed sources said Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Valerian A. Zorin proposed that a single secretary general be named to. replace the late Dag Hammarskjold but with powers limited by three veto-wielding deputies.

The proposal was put forward in a 67 minute meeting of the Big Four U.N. delegation chiefs Tuesday night.

Liberian Ambassador Nathan Barnes, Security Council president for September, arranged the conference for an "exchange of, views" on the situation resulting from Hammarskjold's death,

COLLEGE STATION (Spl)-Directors of the Texas A. and M. College System have a ccepted trusteeship of the Stiles Farm Soundation, a trust valued in excess of \$30,000. Property of the trust includes 3.124 acres of farm land near Thrall, Williamson County, Texas, all tractors and equipment used in operation of the farm and \$25.000 in cash.

The Stiles Farm Foundation was established by bequest from the late J. V. and H. A. Stiles, brothers, for the benefit of the rural population of Texas, Its funds may be used for demonstrations. sa'ary al'ocations, scholarships, fellowships, research and other purposes. The Stiles brothers deignated the members of the board of directors of the Texas A. and M. College System as trustees.

One tract of 513.5 acres may not be sold or mortgaged, but must be operated as a model or demonstration farm near Thrall.

welcome and fascinating item of information to me that a lady I have admired for years, a lady of such wide and prodigious talents that they seem inexhaustible, is to become artist in residence at the Dallas, Tex., Theatre Center for the 1961-62 season. She is, of course, that mime, that painter, that novelist, that autobiographer, that poet, that actress, that extraordinary woman, Engna Enters.

Miss Enters is a lady I have known for some years. She first enchanted me as a mime, a slender, dark, and magic girl playing out in the compass of an evening as many as 20 or more variable women, old women, young women, boy cardinals, virtuous people, evil people, colorful and drab people, and all evoked into bright imagery through her talent.

Paul Baker, the Center's director, announces that Miss Enters not only will share her talents with Dallas, but also will be on the teaching staff at Baylor University in Waco, Tex. Mr. Baker is the head of the theater department there and, again, I must use the word extraordinary. It is an extraordinary theater department, indeed one so unusual and strong and courageous that it has drawn the interest of such men as Charles Laughton- and Burgess Meredith. They have worked there themselves which is more than any other university theater can say

Miss Enters and I once passed most of a Southern California afternoon in discussion of her work and I say that I never in any place talked to an actress so thoroughly alive and so vividly equipped. She knew the difficult world of mime with exquisite understanding. She told me how she had a hard start in 1924 when, on borrowed money, she became her own impresario and presented her first evening of

Miss Enters went to London in 1927 and British critics were knocked into fireworks of priase for her. It has been a long and constantly brighter career for her ever since. She has found time between tours all over the world to write five books. Not one of these has a dull page in

Each Christmas - until last Christmas when circumstances beyond any of her controlling prevented - Miss Enters has drawn and painted her own Christmas cards, about 4 by 7 inches each, each a work of art, and in my own possession are more than a dozen of these. They are framed and hung and genuinely delighting If I seem this day in your life to be ignited by an unquench-

able enthusiasm, I confess it: I am. I consider Miss Enters, totally apart from any acquaintanceship we have, to be a truly great artist in our time. Getting back to Dallas and its

theater, I learn that "The Crossing," based on an incident in the life of George Washington, will be one of four new plays to be produced there this season under Mr. Baker's direction. "The Crossing" was sent to Mr. Baker by Franchot Tone, who found it, so to speak, who read it, who liked it so much that he may go to Dallas and appear in it.

Thus two persons I know will be represented there this season. In connection with Miss Enters, I have a suggestion for Mr. Baker: turn her loose on costume design and setting design. She has ideas that sparkle and are fresh, that make theatrical good sense and they just may draw the attention of the world to your


