Money Included In Nuclear Test Funds Measure

WASHINGTON (Spl) - The House Appropriations committee today voted a \$4,200,000 appropriation for the beginning of construction of the Canadian River-Dam project known as the Sanford Dam and Reservoir. The appropriation was included in a bill voting \$30 million for resumption of nuclear tests by the United States.

The \$4,200,000 had been requested by Rep. Walter Rogers and Rep. George Mahon who have been principal backers of the project in Congress.

The overall project is to cost \$92 million when completed and is designed to furnish water to towns from Borger as far south as Lemesa, including Pampa,


Storms Hit Valley Area
