
Let us now all join in hoisting the ubiquitous socialist high on his own petard. Let's agree to settle for a tax bite for the support of our government, if he will,

Right now taxes for the support of our own goverment, at the federal level, amount to only about one third of the annual budget. Our taxes are also used for the support of hundreds of corporate activities which are not, in any sense, a proper function of government.

Our incomes and phone calls and a thousand and one other items are taxed not just for the support of our own government but for the aid and comfort of most of the other countries of the world. Of course the socialist whines that we must help our friends but when your friends are all dead beats, whiners and beggars, you're better off in the com-


