It is now expected to go into an elongated orbit around the earth before moving into the gravitational field of the sun. Senator Asks For **U.S.-Trained Exiles**

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., wants the United States to help train Cuban exiles and support

them with an American airlift in attacks on their homeland. Goldwater, denouncing President Kennedy's Cuban policy as too timid, also said Sunday that if necessary he would support an invasion sponsored by the Organization of American States to oust the Russians from Cuba.
