than 30 American and South Korean planes took off at dawn today in a stepped up search for small U.S. Army aircraft missing with six men aboard since Sunday.

Poor flying weather has hampered search efforts for the past, two days. Ground parties have not been able to locate the missing aircraft.

The aerial search was concentrated along South Korea's eastern coast, starting from the vicinity of Daepo-Ri, a village 25 miles south of the truce line. It was rom Daepo-Ri that the missing lane took off about 3 p.m. Sunday.

A spokesman for the United Nations Command (UNC) said there was nothing so far to indicate the plane might have been brought down by Communist guns. He did not rule out the possibility however

Reports from the American sector of the truce line said all was quiet Tuesday night. Officers attached to the U.S. Army's 1st Cavalry Division said it was the second calm night in a row in their area which has been marked by skirmishes in which three Americans were killed by Korean infiltrators last North week and by minor clashes since then.
