### Bulgaria to Open **UN Aide's Trial**

VIENNA (UPI) - Communist Bulgaria will try a former official in its U.N. mission this week on charges of spying for the United States. It accuses Ivan-Assen Georgiev of receiving \$200,000 for his espionage work and spending much of it on women and immoral living.

The 56-year-old Georgiev, international lawyer and former counsellor to the Bulgarian mission to the United Nations, is charged with delivering Bulgarian political, economic, and military information to the 'American intelligence service."

The charges were announced Saturday night by the Bulgarian Telegraph Agency (BTA) which said Georgiev's trial would be held Thursday.


