

Over the years all county schools had, one by one, gone into independent districts. But the county school superintendent's office remained in existence, costing taxpayers \$22.000 a year.

In 1962 Mrs. Stark, noting that School Superintendent John T. Bean, a Democrat, the Goodyear Women's Serv- had announced for re-election, made her challenge.

She announced for the office as a Republican. Her platform: to abolish the superintendent's office within 90 days after her election. An amateur in politics, Mrs.

Stark, then 78, and a greatgrandmother, found herself campaigning against a man considered one of the ablest
