This year LAOS plans to send at least 50 volunteers to Peru, Honduras, Chile and Bolivia. Many of them will stay for six months or a year. The group includes physicians, dentists, nurses, medical technicians, teachers, a dietitian, a librarian, a stenographer and a bookkeeper. They range in age from 18 to 75.

"Next year," Kochtitzky said in an interview, "we hope to send two or three hundred volunteers abroad, and to include some of the mission fields of Asia and Africa."

He explained that LAOS has concentrated on Latin America so far because "transportation costs are lower.'






