Three badly decomposed bodies found in shallow graves at a farm pond site near Philadelphia, Miss., were identified today as those of three civil rights workers who disap-

The bodies were found late Tuesday, six weeks and two days after Philadelphia authorities said they were released from fail, by FBI agents digging around a newly-constructed farm bond dam in dense pine thickets and underbrush five miles southwest of the

4 Viet Bases Hit; Oil Depot Blasted

By CHARLES W. CORDDRY WASHINGTON (UPI) - Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara announced today that U. S. Naval aircraft damaged or destroyed approximately 25 patrol boats in their attack on North Viet Nam bases. Two American

planes were lost with pilots, he said Revealing details of retaliatory blows ordered by President Johnson, McNamara told a news conference that 64 sorties — that is, single planes — were launched by the aircraft carriers Tinconderoga and Constellation against four North Vietnamese patrol boat bases and an oil storage depot that supports the bases.





OKLAHOMA CITY (UPI)-Two out of every 100 Oklahoma City area residents registered complaints during six months of exposure to sonic booms, the Federal Aviation Agency (FFA) said Tuesday. The agency said candid,

ed by the FAA to determine public tolerance to noises that would be created by a proposed supersonic transport The agency said publicity

about the tests seemed to produce more complaints than a gradual increase in the intensity of the booms. In its first preliminary report

on the boom test program, the FAA said it received 8,355 damage complaints, including 2,170 formal claims for payment. It approved 163 claims for a total of \$8,608 and rejected 1,732.

Sheriffs' Group To Ask Control On Arms Sales

AUSTIN (UPI) -The Texas Sheriffs' Association will ask the 59th Legislature to restrict the sales of firearms to exconvicts, it was announced this .The association said it will

sponsor legislation similar to that on the books in California, where an ex-convict must get authorization from a judge before he can buy a gun and can be penalized if he fails to get a judge's permission before buying firearms. The sheriffs' group said it will

also seek laws strengthening the hot check and bail bond The association vowed to op-

pose efforts to abolish the death penalty and revise the state's criminal code.

The legislative program announced was outlined in a resolution passed last week at the group's 86th annual crime seminar in Corpus Christi.



The main storage of the extracted helium is in the Cliffside Field northwest of Amarillo. An estimated 62.5 billion cubic feet of helium will be delivered during the life of the program.

That was that the followers of the other of that pair might have built up such a ruckus and head of steam at the Democratic National Convention that Johnson would have been compelled to choose between them for vice president. LBJ did not want either Stevenson or Kennedy on the ticket with

Proscribed with Kennedy and Stevenson were Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara. Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman and Sargent Shriver, Peace Corps director and a Kennedy in-law. All had figured in speculation about the vicepresidential nomination. Such speculation is a kind of bingo or squat tag engaged in by Washington newsmen when they have no better game to

four less likely Democratic vice presidential nominees than Rusk. McNamara, Freeman and Shriver. But it is not easy. Rusk and McNamara are aloof types. They are warm, perhaps, in their personal relationships but cold as IBM computers in their public associations. Moreover, McNamara is a Republican, if anything, and Rusk has no political background at all. As public speakers, Rusk and McNamara are long on logic and solid argument. Both are dull when in full cry. None could accuse either of being a good campaigner able to stir an audience to any kind of emotional fervor.

Sorry Relationship

McNamara is identified with the foggiest, soggiest, sorriest area of U.S. foreign relations-Viet Nam. Rusk has responsibility for our whole world situation. It is no secret that the situation of the United States in the cold war world today is not the strongest argument for a Democratic landslide next November.

Shriver's Kennedy connections must be computed in political terms. But against him it would be argued that he should sing in the chorus for some time before aspiring to rolo parts. In - law relationship to America's first political family is not enough.

Freeman is the only polttician among the four. He also is a lame duck governor of Minnesota who was glad to escape the political shadows for the agriculture hot spot. That cabinet seat is almost as dead-
