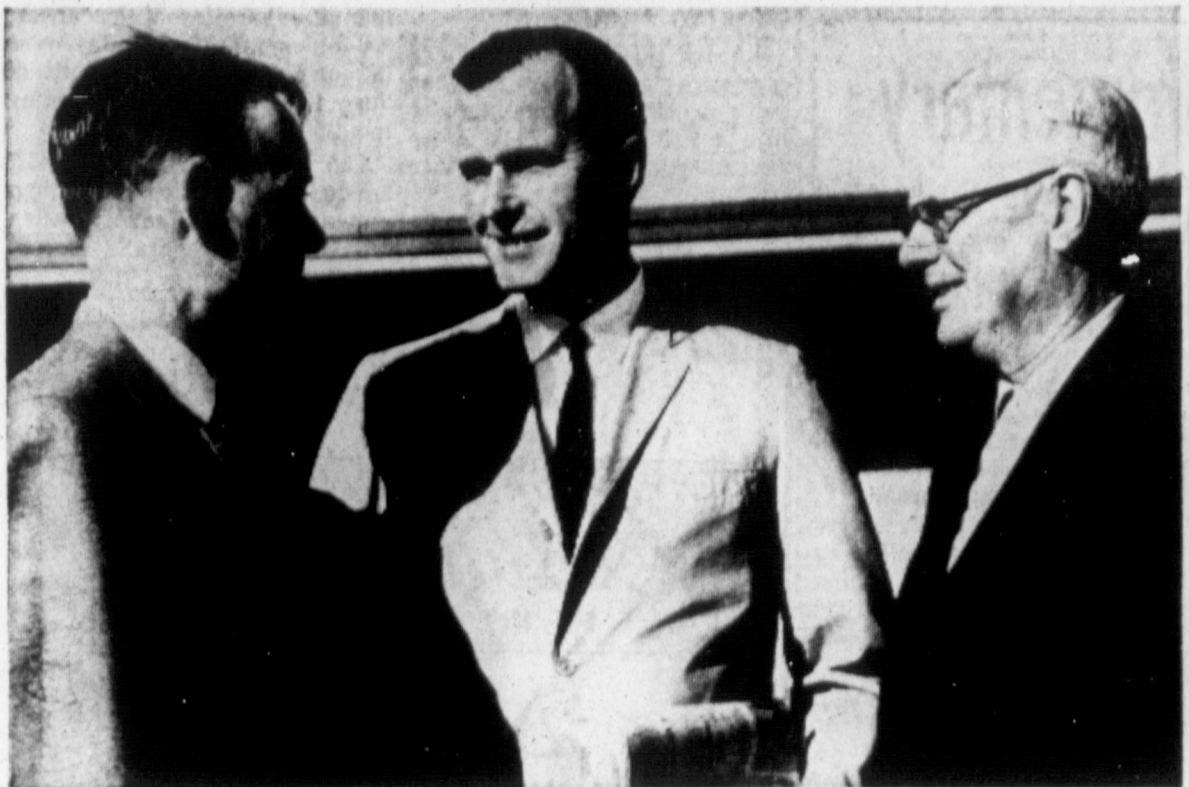

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## City School Expenses to Be Cut Under '64 Budget

The overall expenses for Pampa schools in the 1964-65 year will be about \$45,000 less than 1963-64, according to the tentative budget adopted last night by the Pampa Independent District school board.

The total 1964-65 budget tentatively calls for expenditures of \$2,675,162.35 compared with estimated receipts of \$2,610,000. Debt service will increase from \$387,808 this year to \$430,000 in the new budget.

If Syncom-3 is not already in proper alignment with the equator, small gas jets aboard the craft can make the necessary correction. NASA said the satellite is at the 22,300-mile altitude needed to match its orbital speed with earth's rotation to give it the stationary effect.

The gas jets will also be used to shove the satellite along the equator for the next 10 days to a position over the international dateline where it will be ready to relay Olympic telecasts from Japan to the United States Oct. 10-24.

Syncom-3, launched Wednesday, is the last of three satellites in the research program that proved a system of three Syncom-like moonlets could give the world a continuous space communications network.

The New Communications Satellite Corp. (COMSAT), which is coordinating the Syncom-3 Olympic television coverage, plans to fire its own communications satellite into a stationary orbit next year in the first commercial venture of its kind.

## Johnson's Hiring of Women Trend Setter

WASHINGTON (UPI)—President Johnson's hiring of women to do some of the big jobs for government is a trend setter for the entire country.

Local governments and private industry also are looking at the qualifications of women with new eyes.

So say Assistant Secretary of Labor Esther Peterson and Mrs. Mary Keyserling, head of the Women's Bureau.

Mrs. Keyserling says the President's recognition of female talent has made the federal government "a showcase" for the country. She says it has given a "tremendous psychological" lift to those who strive to break down the discriminatory barriers against career women.

Fewer women, she said, are facing the prospect of job openings tagged with "only a man need apply."

Mrs. Keyserling compares the impact of the White House campaign with the granting of suffrage to women. The equal pay law and Title VII of the

Civil Rights Act which bars discrimination in employment on account of race or sex also is a great boon for females who work outside the home, she believes. It takes effect in one year.

Thirty-three states have followed the national suit by setting up commissions on the status of women and they are tackling the problems at hand with enthusiasm and energy.

Mrs. Peterson says "we have to keep pushing," that a lot remains to be done to make a woman's lot an equal one. But she believes the White House impetus is spilling over.

Businessmen are becoming more aware of different standards applied to the female staff. Women, too, have told her "I'm losing my guilt complex."

Neither Mrs. Keyserling nor Mrs. Peterson worry about the loss of femininity in the increase of women executives. "We're less feminine when we feel underprivileged, when we have a chip on our shoulder," said the woman's bureau head.

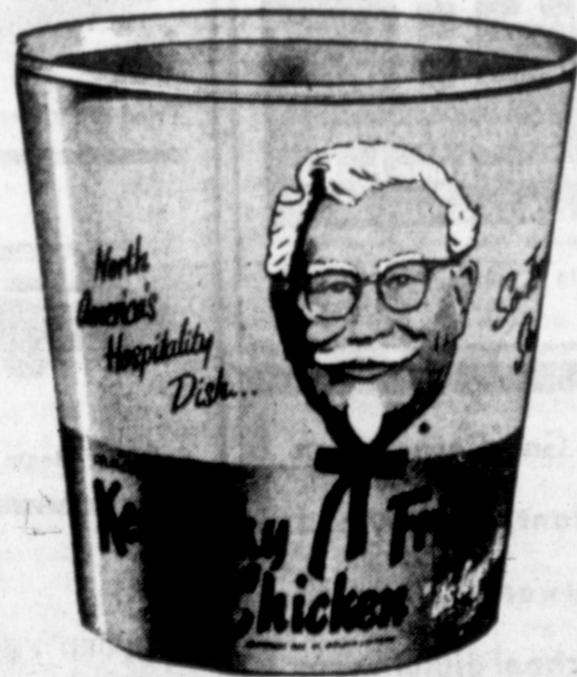
