





Q - Should I thaw frozen fish before cooking?

In American Diet

where do we get it?

A -- Not necessarily. Just alow a few extra minutes of cooking time, advise food specialists of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Interior. However, when fish are to be either breaded, fried, or stuffed, you'll find it more convenient to thaw them first to make handling easier. Thaw frozen fish in the refrigerator in their original wrappings. Cook thawed fish immediately for best quality. Be sure you don't overcook it. Cook fish just until it flakes easily with a fork.

For snacks that are high in nutrition and taste - and low in calories - munch on carrot strips, celery, cauliflower or melba toast, say Extension Service food and nutrition specialists. 



SATURN FALLS

WASHINGTON (UPI) - An 18-ton satellite launched Friday by a Saturn rocket fell out of orbit Tuesday over the Indian Ocean.

The 80-foot satellite, with a boiler plate version of the Apolto moon rocket at one end, was put in orbit at Cape Kennedy in the seventh successful test of the Saturn. The end came 3 days, 19 hours and 37 minutes after launch. It had made 59 revolutions around the earth.
