

Murphy Unruffled By Girls Suicide

MIAMI (UPI)—Jack (Murphy the Surf) Murphy, apparently unruffled by the suicide of his beautiful blonde girlfriend and common-law wife, was scheduled to appear in New York's Supreme Court yesterday with two co-defendants to answer charges in connection with the "great gem theft."

The body of Bonnie Lou Suter, 22, was found Saturday night in the apartment she shared with Murphy.

On an end table police found an open Bible, an empty bottle of barbiturates and a penciled note addressed to "Darling Jack."

U. S. Strategy Foggy In Viet

WASHINGTON (UPI) — U.S. strategy in South Viet Nam has become obscured by an almost impenetrable fog of press speculation.

A newspaper headline announces: "Expansion of war seen." Articles predict that bombing raids in Communist North Viet Nam are about to begin. Others say the raids will be in Laos. Still others say there will be no raids.

With few exceptions the Johnson administration has simply sat back and let the speculation continue.

What does all this mean to the average American?

What he is witnessing is a tense game of strategic maneuvering played between governments at the highest level and with very high stakes.

Interpreted As Hinting
Twice in the last two weeks the governments of the United States and South Viet Nam have issued statements which have been interpreted by perhaps 30 per cent of newsmen as "hinting" at expansion of the Vietnamese war.

The first was a White House statement issued Dec. 1 at the close of U.S. Ambassador Maxwell D. Taylor's Washington talks. It called attention to "accumulating evidence" of increased North Vietnamese infiltration into the South and spoke of measures to improve the battle against communism "in all its aspects."

The second was a statement issued by the South Vietnamese government last Friday, with U.S. approval. It announced increases in U.S. military and economic aid to improve programs generally "and to restrain mounting infiltration."

Oklahoma School Goes Underground

DUKE, Okla. (UPI) — Workmen have started filling a big hole in the ground here with classrooms. The Duke School is going underground with a 20th century version of the dugouts settlers excavated when this southwestern Oklahoma town was part of Indian Territory.

The school board says the underground school will be cheaper to heat and cool and will provide safe shelter in the spring, when persistent tornadoes and hailstorms rumble around the countryside.

The subterranean facility replaces an above-ground building that burned last spring. The only parts of the new school that will poke up are the auditorium-gymnasium and the superintendent's office.

Revolutions for All Latin America

NEW YORK (UPI) — Cuban Minister of Industry Ernesto Che Guevara Sunday predicted that the struggles of revolution would enflame "every country in Latin America."

Fidel Castro's number one aide also admitted that while Cuba's Communist revolution was not "exportable" his country was helping to train Latin American subversives to "acquire some military knowledge."

But Guevara denied Cuba was shipping arms to aid the spread of revolution. He spoke to newsmen during and after a television interview program.

Safecrackers Loot Store Of \$20,000

DALLAS (UPI) — The manager of the Sage, Inc. discount store on Irving Blvd. discovered yesterday that safecrackers had stolen more than \$20,000 in cash during the weekend, along with merchandise ranging from narcotics to walkie talkie radios and pistols.

John Monsees called police when he arrived at his office to find the safe broken open by what was believed to be two or more men who entered the store through a vent in the roof.

Detective C. L. Smith said the store's alarm system guarded the doors only. A loaded shotgun found on the floor by the safe led police to believe one man stood guard during the burglary.

Police Seeking Colorado Killer

TRINIDAD, Colo. (UPI) — Police today were investigating the fatal shooting of an elderly Nebraska man who was gunned down in his bed while he slept early Sunday.

The victim was identified as Ben Mayfield, 85, of Kimball, Neb. He had traveled to Trinidad to visit his two brothers, John and Harvey, both in their 70s.

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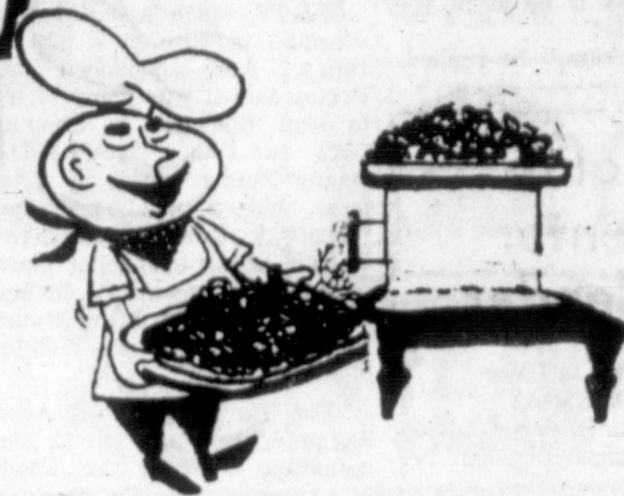

Ailing Duke In Houston Hospital For Checkup

HOUSTON (UPI) — Texas doctors and medical aides, trying not to forget their newly learned lessons in royal protocol, hoped to finish up tests today on the ailing Duke of Windsor.

The Duke, who gave up the British throne to marry a Baltimore-born divorcee, arrived Monday for treatment of an aneurysm, a weak spot in one of his abdominal arteries that has ballooned to the size of an orange.

He will undergo surgery, probably in the next three or four days. He is however, a hospital spokesman said after a physical exam Monday in "excellent physical condition."

The 70-year-old Duke, who likes to dance the twist with the international set, looked hipper and held a lighthearted press conference Monday, joking about his Christmas bills.

Physicians at Methodist Hospital sought the advice of the local British consul, Peter Hope, as to what they should

call the Duke.

"Your royal highness, on the first occasion," said Hope, and "your highness," for the rest of the conversation. The Duchess, he said, should be addressed as "your grace."

The Duke and Duchess were driven from the railroad station to the hospital in a \$35,000 rented Rolls-Royce, the same one hired last week by visiting Melvin Belli of San Francisco. Jack Ruby's trial defense lawyer.

A six-room suite has been set aside for them on the fourth floor of the new hospital. They found a bouquet of orchids from Queen Elizabeth, the Duke's niece, and his sister, the princess royal, had been delivered to the suite.

"I think the hospital is very gay for Christmas," said the Duchess, the former Wallis Warfield Simpson — the "woman I love" for whom the Duke, then King Edward VIII, gave up his crown in an historic radio address in 1936.

A reporter asked what Christmas meant to her?

"Presents," she said.

"What does it mean to you, your highness?"

"Pay for them," he replied.

New Drama Due on CBS

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — CBS-TV has finally decided to enter a new one-hour drama series about a prosecuting attorney, "For The People," in television's suicide slot: Opposite NBC-TV's top-rated "Bonanza" on Sunday nights.

CBS-TV, which is shuffling its schedule because of a slip in ratings, had announced last Friday that it was going to try to dent "Bonanza" by bringing back two other shows: The Danny Thomas series in rerun form, and a panel program, "Celebrity Game," with Carl Reiner. But a change of plans during the weekend ditched these and brought in the drama series, which stars William Shatner.

"For The People" will have its premiere Jan. 24. In the meantime, the hour slot, which is between the Ed Sullivan show and "Candid Camera," will be filled by some specials, including a Dec. 27 color broadcast of England's Royal Ballet and some reruns of the outstanding Fred Astaire television musical efforts.

As previously announced, the CBS-TV series which have recently been trenched by "Bonanza" — the Joey Bishop program and "My Living Doll" — are being shifted to other nights. On Dec. 22, Bishop moves to Tuesdays, replacing "World War I," a documentary series that switches to early Sunday evenings. And this Wednesday, "My Living Doll," which is about a female robot, moves with "Mr. Ed" — the talking horse — into the time period being vacated by "CBS Reports." "CBS Reports" in turn shifts to Mondays starting tonight replacing "Slattery's People," which will move to Friday's Christmas Day replacing "The Reporter," which is canceled. Amen.

"For The People" is produced by Herb Brodtkin, who also turns out "The Defenders," which of course is about defense attorneys. So the new series about prosecutors may have some slight significance if you like to read things into other things like that. In any case, "For The People" would seem to face the problem that prosecutors are about as exciting as weekly heroes as reporters or press agents. It is possible, however, that CBS-TV has finally succeeded in achieving a friendly lynch scene.

Congo Rebels Have Killed 20,000 Persons; Most Die In Stanleyville

LONDON (UPI) — George Tomson, minister of state for foreign affairs, told Parliament Monday the Congo rebels have massacred an estimated 20,000 persons, 5,000 of them in Stanleyville.

Thomson said 27 British subjects still were in rebel-held territory. He rejected any suggestion of direct negotiations with the rebels.

"We cannot negotiate with a people who are in armed rebellion against the government we recognize as the legitimate gov-

ernment of the Congo," he said. In his report, Thomson emphasized that most of the rebels victims have been Congolese. He said the non-Congolese victims included 18 Malaysian and 9 Indonesian rubber experts as well as a nun who was a British subject.

Thomson said two Australians and one citizen of New Zealand, in addition to the 27 British subjects, were believed still in rebel-held territory. The advance of the Congolese army offered the best hope for their safety, he said.

Foreign News Commentary

Back on July 1, 1948, the Soviet representative walked out on the four-power Commandatura ruling Berlin and there came into being the divided city now known as West Berlin and East Berlin.

It marked the end of four-power rule of the city which the United States, Britain, France and the Soviet Union had agreed upon on June 5, 1945, and it paved the way for a series of crises culminating in erection of the Berlin wall on Aug. 13, 1961.

It was as a side result of Nikita Khrushchev's retreat in the Cuban crisis of October, 1962, that the situation eased, and continued to ease as Khrushchev became more deeply involved in his quarrel with the Red Chinese.

Since then, both as regards West Berlin and a reunified Germany, by tacit agreement it has been considered best to let sleeping dogs lie.

Exploratory Stirrings

But now once again there are exploratory stirrings on both sides.

On the Russian side there has been a proposal that the four powers should get together in routine meetings in West Berlin to discuss "outstanding matters of mutual interest."

It would be the first diplomatic contact of all four powers since 1948. The only vestiges of the Commandatura remaining have been the Air Control Center over Berlin and the administration of Spandau Prison for war criminals.

The British have expressed some interest in finding out what the Russians have in mind. The United States and France have shown frank skepticism, suspecting the Russian move to be an attempt to revive four-power rule for West Berlin while still insisting on so-called sovereignty for West Berlin.

Matter Of Reunification
In another area, the West Germans have been sounding out the Western Allies on the possibility of a new approach to the Russians on the matter of reunification of all of Germany.

The U.S. position on this is said to be generally favorable, with France once more opposed.

France believes such an approach would suggest the Allies were willing to make concessions.

They also say they believe the Russians would refuse to reach any agreement so long as West Germany remains committed to the U.S.-proposed multi-lateral nuclear force for NATO.

Chancellor Ludwig Erhard has an election coming up next year and he wants to reassure the German people that reunification remains a No. 1 objective of his government.

The Germans are reported also to believe that the simple question of economics might sway the Russians in favor of some concessions of their own.

World Exchange Exports
Bonn reports say the West Germans would be willing to undertake a long-term program involving exports of more than \$10 billion to the Soviets in exchange for a gradual liberalization of political conditions inside East Germany. One such condition would be freer travel across the East-West borders.

Such a proposal was in its outline stage when the Germans still were expecting a visit from Khrushchev. Now it is said to have been revived.

The United States long has favored increased individual contacts between the two Germans and believes that West Germany's economic strength works in its favor in the long-term absorption of the East.

At any rate, soundings are being taken.

A pair of cold fronts stretching from New England to northern Florida began dispelling thick fog that crippled airline service in New York City and made driving treacherous.

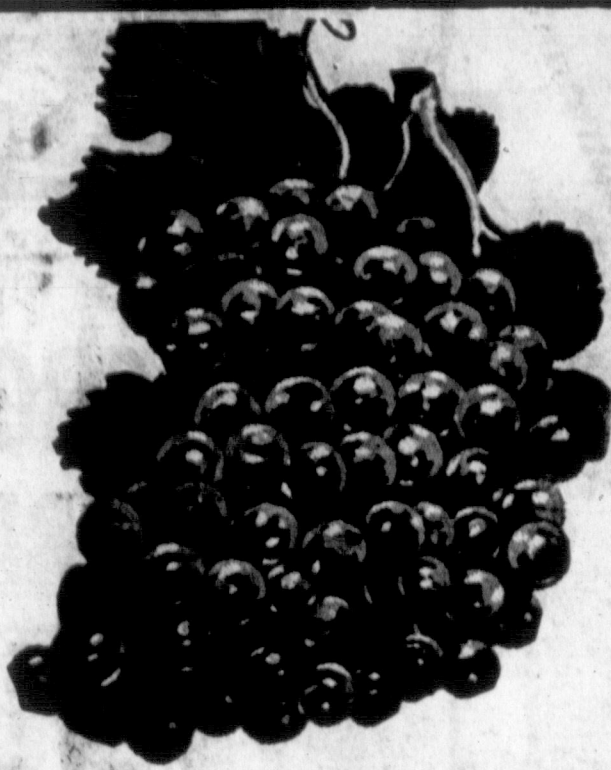
Another high pressure system sent cold air streaming over the West and south central states from Nevada to Alabama.
