MCLEAN (Spl.) — Approximately 600 persons turned out Sunday for the formal opening of McLean's new 20-bed hospital.

Hospital personnel took visitors on a tour of the new structure, which will be operated by Highland General Hospital in Pampa.

Construction on the hospital was started last July and completed in February.

Canadian C-C Builds Rest Home

CANADIAN (Spl.) — This community is proud of a chamber of commerce project which brought into being the chamber-operated, non-profit Edward Abraham Memorial nursing home.

The \$300,000 project is the largest ever attempted by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce and was built by Canadian area citizens through their contributions all the way from \$2 individual donations to the \$70,000 contributed by the Abraham families of Canadian.

The \$70,000 project-launching gift in December of 1961 was matched by the people of the community and later was augmented by a Hill-Burton hospital grant.

The home, built to accommodate 37 patients in private and semi-private rooms, presently has five patients from Pampa among the total of 20.

Under terms of the trust by which it was founded the non-profit home is administered by a board of directors appointed by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce. It is housed in a spacious masonry building, completely fire-proof and incorporating the best in modern design for the care and comfort of the elderly. Rooms are all fully air conditioned with individual thermostat controls in each room.

The home has spacious lobby and dining room facilities, a private chapel, a TV lounge with color television, and barber and beauty shop. It is administered by a trained staff including a registered nurse and licensed vocational nurse.

The hill-top location affords an unrestricted view of the broad Canadian River valley and its surrounding hills from every room. The administrator of the home is Eugene Thompson.
