

#### **Texas Forest** Service Slates **Anniversary**

COLLEGE STATION (UPI)-The Texas Forest Service will observe May 18 the 50th anniversary of its helping to profect 26.5 million acres of forests -more than the combined acreage of New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island and Massa-

The anniversary will be observed with a program four miles south of Lufkin on U.S. Highway 59. Speakers will include L. B. Zeagler, president of the Texas Forestry Association: Dr. M. T. Harrington, chancellor of the Texas A&M University System, and Dr. A. D. Folweiler, director of the

Forest Service. A part of the Texas A&M University System, the Texas Forest Service has more than 300 regular employes. 29 of whom are graduate forests.

The "piney woods" region of East Texas, with about 12.5 million acres of pine and hardwood, accounts for the most valuable part of Texas' forests

was created in 1915, there has been a revolution in Texas forest management.

When the service started. there was widespread fear that wasteful lumbering practices were taking Texas down the road to a timber famine.

Texas now grows wood faster than it can be used. Trees are managed as a renewable crop that can support the state's. large and growing wood-using

Since its early days, the Texas Forest Service has encouraged all woodland owners, large and small, to grow timber as a

The service continually provides first-hand advice on forest management problemswhat to plant, how to cut for sustained growth and how to protect woodlands from fires. pests and disease.

Provide Employment

There are 926 wood-using plants in Texas, providing fulltime employment for 34 000 persons with payrolls totaling \$138 million a year, or 9 per cent of the state's industrial payroll.


The products of wood-using plants is worth a total of more than \$500 million a year. Products from Texas forests includes poles, piling, lumber, ties, newsprint, furniture, toys flooring, resin, chemicals, medicines, fibres, dyes, plywood

From 15-24 million fence posts are produced every year in Texas. Using only the annual increment, it takes newsprint from the woodlands of 49 acres to print a single issue of a big Texas metropolitan newspaper: Regulate Floods

Texas forests also help regulate stream flood and control erosion: they provide a living place for wildlife, a place for livestock to forage and recreational areas for city people.

The Forest Service carries on an extensive fire prevention education program and mans 93 lookout towers in winter and spring months. The service onerates nine nine seed orchards. where 400 million pine seedlings have been raised and sold at nominal cost in the past 25 years to landowners.

The service also administers the four state forests, located near Maydelle, Conroe. Hyatt and Kirbyville. In recent years, it has developed a pine tree resistant to drought.

MOSCOW (UPI) - Former Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev is suffering the strangest fate

of any fallen Soviet leader. The one-time ruler of "all the Russians" has become the man that never was.

He is the first complete "unperson' of that stature since the Russian Revolution.

Khrushchev's name has been assiduously omitted from the press, and erased from new editions of history books in which it figured prominently in earlier editions published before his ouster last Oct. 15.

#### **Financial** Gossip

NEW YORK (UPI) - Like physicians examining an active athlete, economists in public and private life have been listening to the heartheat of the economy as it functioned in the first three months and prepared for the months ahead

Their diagnosis: Strong and showing few signs of strain. Likely to maintain good stamina for the long pull, perhaps

not at a sprinter's pace. At Hot Springs, Va., where was held a weekend meeting of the Business Council, Gardner Ackley, chairman of the President's Council of Economic Advisers, indicated he was adhering to a forecast previously made of a GNP level this year of \$660 billion, GNP is the gross national product, the sum of the nation's goods and serv-

Businessmen were inclined to agree with him. They also were heartened by the possibility of excise tax cuts beyond the \$1.75 billion slash which President Johnson has asked Congress to allow by July 1.

Most of the talk about the GNP level has been in the \$660 billion range for the year, and some are even higher. A.W. Zelomek, head of the International Statistical Bureau. Inc., estimates it will stand at \$661 billion, compared with \$622.6 for 1964, and will be at a second quarter (April - June) rate of \$657.8, compared to \$618.6 billion in the second quarter of 1964.

As for the future, other sources indicate a continued rise. The National Planning Association, a non-profit and nonpolitical organization headquartered in Washington, issued a report on the "dollar cost of our national goals,"-after a two-year study.

This time he is threatening to buy wheat for his underfedconstituents unless the United States quicklike resumes shipments of surplus wheat to Egypt. The shipments were suspended in midwinter after anti-American demonstrations in Cairo durig which the U.S. Information Center was sacked and burned.

Nasser after that incident per formed a ritual of: "Oooops, so sorry, please." He told his people a week ago that he had requested the United States to resume wheat shipments without avail. Outraged by what he interpreted as an American effort to exert economic pressure. Nasser sounded off with a real good deal for Americans.

"Not one Egyptian will give up his honor and dignity of independence under economic-pressure:" Nasser shouted. "We will buy wheat with hard currency if we have to and we are ready to eat half a loaf to preserve our dignity."


