Senate Action Hoped Where House Failed

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Johnson administration looked to the Senate today for action it failed to get in the House—a drastic cut in the proposed \$1.5 billion pay raise for federal employes.

On a 370-7 roll call vote Thursday night, the House ap-proved the bill that exceeded by \$410 million a year the re-com-mendation made by Pres-ident Johnson.

The sentiment was so one-sided that the House Democratic leadership put up no opposition, apparently thinking the best idea was to try to cut the bill in the Senate.

Johnson has strongly hinted that he would veto the big bill,

LBJ To Sign Bill in Liberty's Shadow

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Pres-ident Johnson is going to sign the new immigration reform bill in the shadow of the Statue of Liberty, the symbol of Amer-ican freedom to millions of im-migrants since 1886.

The White House announced Thursday, shortly after final congressional approval of the measure, that the signing cer-emony would be held out of doors Sunday (about 5 p.m. EDT), not far from the base of the statue on Bedloe's Island in New York Harbor.

Johnson plans to fly to New York Sunday morning, stay overnight and meet with Pope Paul VI on Monday.

The bill the President is to sign abolishes the 41-year-old national origins quota system and replaces it with what amounts to a world quota of 170,000 immigrants a year from outside the Western Hemi-sphere.

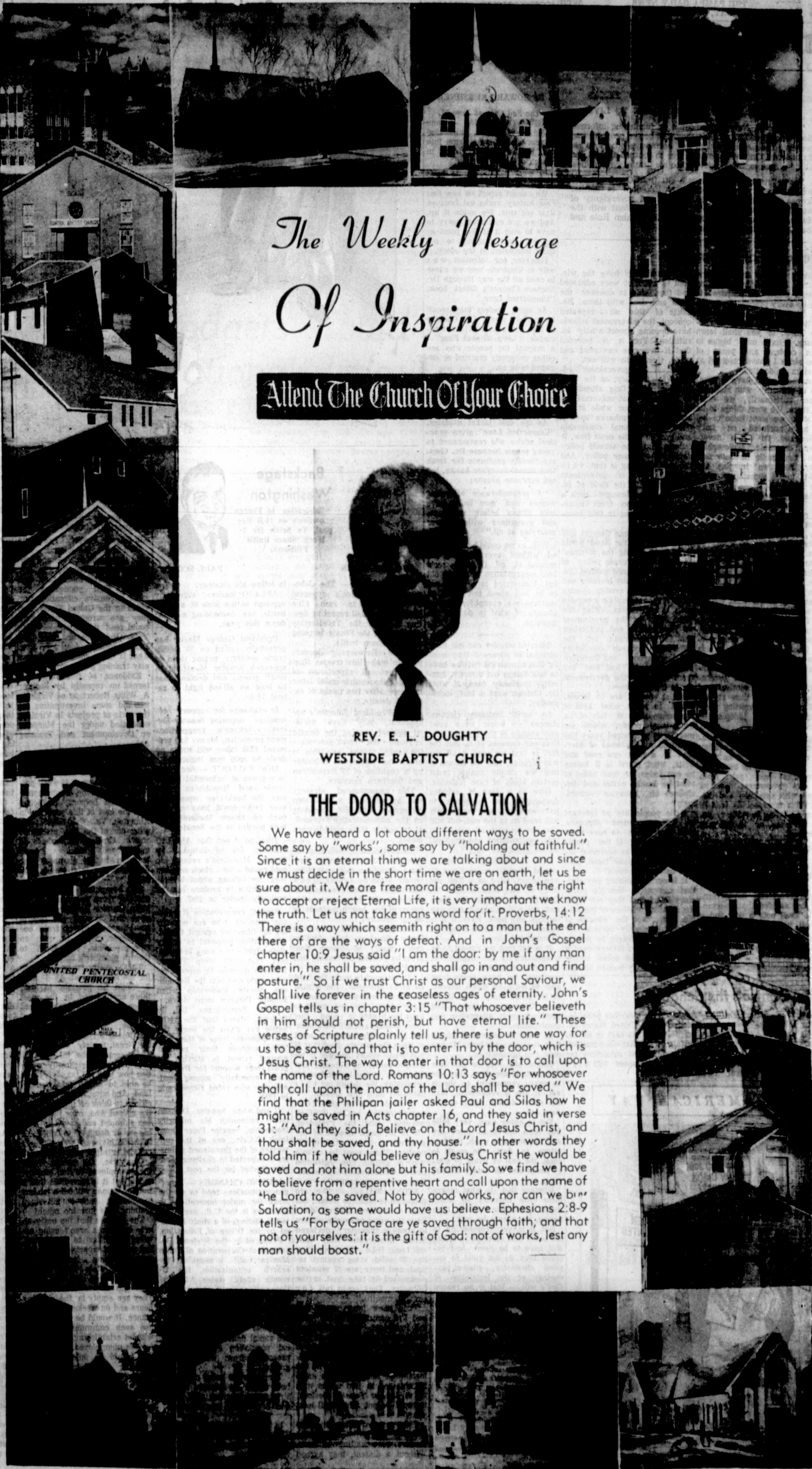

THE DOOR TO SALVATION

Since it is an eternal thing we are talking about and since we must decide in the short time we are on earth, let us be sure about it. We are free moral agents and have the right to accept or reject Eternal Life, it is very important we know the truth. Let us not take mans word for it. Proverbs, 14:12 There is a way which seemith right on to a man but the end there of are the ways of defeat. And in John's Gospel chapter 10:9 Jesus said "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out and find pasture." So if we trust Christ as our personal Saviour, we shall live forever in the ceaseless ages of eternity. John's Gospel tells us in chapter 3:15 "That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life." Church Council Will Take Week Off

By RUFUS S. GOODWIN, United Press International. VATICAN CITY (UPI)—The Ecumenical Council, moving quickly towards conclusion will take a week-long vacation later this month and then hold a public session for Pope Paul VI to put into effect various decisions of the gathering.

The more than 2,000 prelates gathered in St. Peter's Basilica for today's session were told that there would be a recess from Oct. 17 to 24. In addition, on Nov. 1 there will be a public session "for the pontiff to promulgate any documents which are ready."

It appeared that the documents on "the pastoral duties of bishops" and "on religious orders" would be ready. In addition, an important scheme dealing with non-Christians—which includes the much debated section on Jews—probably will be ready, although a final vote has not yet been taken.

It also was publicly announced at the meeting that Pope Paul would address the gathering at their session on Tuesday following his return from the United Nations in New York. He will go directly from the airport to the council hall to give them a first-hand report on his peace plea before the world body.

The prelates are studying a Catholic document which makes an unprecedented overture of friendship to the Hindu, Buddhist and Moslem faiths. It praises believers of all three.

The document, containing the church's declaration on its relation to non-Christians, was received by the clerics Thursday. The declaration will come up for a council vote later this month. It represents the church's first steps to open a positive era of collaboration, not only with other Christians but with believers of all other faiths.

"This is the first time that a conciliar statement has looked not just to the Jews but to the Moslems, Hindus and Buddhists and has spoken of the presence of God among these people," said Father Thomas Stransky, an American Paulist priest. Stransky is a member of the body which drew up the declaration—the Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity.

World Bank Will Hear Johnson

Foreign Commentary

FROM THE FOREIGN NEWS CABLES:

FEWER RAIDS: Reports circulating in diplomatic circles in London say U.S. air raids on Communist North Viet Nam can be expected to be slowed down in coming weeks simply because there is not much of military importance left to bomb, aside from Hanoi itself. The Viet Cong too has suffered more heavily lately than the Communists are prepared to admit, and there are growing indications the back of the Viet Cong may be broken within a year or 18 months. But the diplomats say Hanoi appears no more willing than ever to negotiate and that peace talks likely to be initiated by the United Nations General Assembly stand little chance of success.

ECONOMIC MANEUVER: France's able Finance Minister Valery Giscard d'Estaing, 40, will make a strong pitch at next week's International Monetary Fund (IMF) session to make France appear in the eyes of the non-committed nations as the only country that can take care of their economic worries.

Indications in Europe are that the Soviet Union has benefited enormously from Premier Alexei Kosygin's offer to mediate in the Pakistan-Indian war and his suggestion for a summit meeting between Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri and President Mohammad Ayub Khan on Soviet soil. Diplomats believed the appeal was aimed largely at winning Afro-Asian support for Russia in its quarrel with Red China. But it also helped on the home front. Most East bloc nations praised Russia and the United Nations and scored Peking for making inflammatory moves against India.

NUCLEAR ARMING: The Soviet Union has gone all-out recently in condemning what it calls West German efforts to gain control of nuclear weapons and has warned that the Warsaw Pact nations will take "appropriate measures" if West Germany gets them. Diplomats in Moscow say they doubt seriously the Russian opposition will lead to Russia's handling over nuclear weapons to members of the Warsaw Pact, however.

KIM COMEBACK: Kim Chong Pil, the controversial general who was South Korean President Park Chung Hee's right-hand man apparently is about to regain his No. 2 position there. Kim went abroad last year when student demonstrations led to imposition of martial law, but has returned to Seoul. Since then he has been talking with leaders of every walk of life and seems to have appeased much of the antagonism of his erstwhile political foes within the ruling party.
