VATICAN CITY, (UPI) Pope Paul VI will promulgate the Ecumenical Council's historic document on Jews and other non-christian religions in a public session in St. Peter's

Council officials informed the 2,500 bishops the Pope had decided to add the declaration on non-christians to four other decrees already scheduled for promulgation on the day. The promulgation will be preceded by public votes of the bishops on the five documents-a simple formality since all have already been passed by the coun-

The other four documents scheduled for promulgation are a tract on the role of bishops, which makes them more independent of the Roman curia, and documents on the renovation of religious orders, seminaries and christian education.

When council Secretary General Archbishop Pericle Felici first announced plans for the public session three days ago, he listed only those four documents as scheduled for promulgation. The tract on nonchristians, which deplores antisemitism and clears the Jews of collective responsibility for the crucifixion of Chrst, won final approval a few hours after that announcement.

Today's communique said that since that document was now also ready for promulgation, the Pope had decided to add it to the list.

Matson answered, "Yes, I am sure it will hurt me a little bit, for one thing I'll be getting a late start and won't be in shape like I usually am. I really don't expect to do too well in track this season.'

Does he think fans will be yelling for a basket every time he shoots like they yell for a 70 foot heave every time he throws the shot?

"Oh, I really don't think so, I don't think there will be too much pressure on me, but I guess I'll just have to wait and see, Matson said.

What does he think will give him the most trouble in starting his basketball career?

"Mainly just getting back in shape. I hope I can so I won't get hurt. I'm afraid I might injure a leg or something if I can't get back in good enough shape," the sopho-

To review a bit Matson is Pampa's second ranking alltime scorer in Harvester history and a better rebounder has never been on a Pampa basketball team.

His sophomore year Randy averaged 11.2 points a game, 17.2 his junior year and 12.5 for 16 games his senior year. His rebounding average nearly doubles his scoring average for all three years.




