other states. Other areas reported very little decrease in personnel or loss of payroll.

Both Abilene and Austin will lose two Nike-Hercules sites each, but both will show other

In Abilene, the 516th troop

and the annual payroll will increase by \$2.6 million.

In Austin, an additional 1,100 persons will be brought to the Bergstrom Air Force Base tactical air command from Waco. At El Paso, the 95th bomb wing of the Strategic Air Command at Biggs Air Force Base will be inactivated by July

City officials said El Paso will lose about \$3.5 million a year when the 2,300 military and 300 civilian personnel leave. But this will partially be offset. El Paso will gain the Army's East Coast branch of the Defense Language Institute, the Pentagon said.

A total of 956 military and 319 civilian personnel, including resident students, will be affected. The transfer will be completed by December, 1967. The school will take over part of the present Biggs Air Force

The Army also will move a portion of its aviation materiel laboratories from Fort Eustis, Va., to El Paso. A total of 120 military and 230 civilian per-

sonnel will be affected by that transfer, also to be completed by December, 1967.

A third transfer will send the Air Force Language Training School, now at Lackland AFB, San Antonio, to El Paso. It will be completed by December, 1967, and 544 military and 181 civilian personnel will be affected by the transfer.

In Houston, the 924th and 926th carrier air reserve groups will be inactivated and the Civil Air Patrol headquarters will be relocated Ellington Air Force Base said 263 military and 609 civilian jobs would go, but that career Air Force personnel would be aided in find-

ing jobs in the Houston area. Officers at Ellington said they do not expect the changes to have much effect on Houston's economy

City officials in Big Spring and Beaumont shared that economic viewpoint.

The 331st fighter interceptor squadron at Webb Air Force base near Big Spring will be inactivated by October 1967, and the Navy and Marine Corps reserve training center in Beaumont will be relocated by June 1970.

As part of a nation - wide program to streamline the ZIP Code system, Postmaster Lynn Boyd announced today that effective next Jan. 15 a single five-digit ZIP Code number will serve the entire Pampa community.

Everyone in Pampa will have the same ZIP Code number. which is 79065, already in use for delivered mail. Only post office box patrons will be affected. The box ZIP Code of

79066 will no longer be used. Postmaster Boyd said Pampa is one of 643 cities in which two or more ZIP Codes have been merged into a single ZIP Code number in order to simplify the system:

"Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien has instructed us to do all we possibly can to make the transition process easier for the public," Boyd said "So we are delaying the effective date until Jan. 15 in order to avoid confusion during the Christmas mailing season.

"Also, mail users may continue to use their old ZIP Code number on stationery and other printed mailing equipment until the present supply is exhausted. Business firms that have already ZIP coded their files will not be required to update them, but can make the transition to the single code as they make routine changes for other purposes."





## This Week In Business

NEW YORK (UPI) -Christmas shopping got off to an early and brisk start this week in most of the country although bad weather kept retail trade down in scattered parts of New England and the Midwest.

Merchants in the South Atlantic states found their cash registers ringing up sales 13 to 17 per cent above a year ago and, for the country as a whole, Dun & Bradstreet reported retail trade on the week up 4 to 8 per cent from the start of the 1964 Christmas season,

As for autos, the Big Three-Ford, General Motors and Chrysler-sold 773,000 cars in November, well above the industry's previous record for the month of 640,000 set in 1963. Auto output this week, however, will be down about 2 per cent from last week to 216,000 cars because of the Fisher Body strike at Flint, Mich, Production for December is scheduled at 920,000 cars, which will be a record for the month if achieved.

Unemployment was disclosed by the Labor Department to have dropped in mid-November to 4.2 per cent of the working force, the lowest mark since August, 1957.

The consumer price index climbed in October to a record 110.4 per cent of the 1957-59 average and the Commerce Department said rising domestic prices are hurting U.S. sales abroad.

The Census Bureau said imports surged 29 per cent in October while exports advanced only 6 per cent. However, it was explained that the import jump was caused in part by a hangover from the maritime strike. Goods that should have cleared customs late in the summer were delayed weeks in unloading and were caught in snarls of paperwork to swell the October figure.

President Johnson said at the "Texas White House" that the U.S. economy will surge to new highs in 1966 and athough figures released by the White House indicated the possibility of a deficit as high as \$10.5 billion because of the war in Viet Nam, Johnson said plainly he did not fear inflation now.

Unless you're listening or thinking about Sam Allen, the "Music Minister" at the Pampa First Baptist Church. Not many people know it but Sam was a great track star and did some pretty good basketball coaching. A lot of people knows he sings very well.

#### World's Champ

Sam isn't the type fellow to boast about past performances and he's had some good ones, holding the World's record for the indoor high hurdles in 1936, running the 60 yards in 6.3 seconds and tieing the world mark for the 120 yard highs in 14 seconds flat.

Sam also got the Wayland Flying Queens off to a flying start (pardon the pun) and brought them into national prominance in just five years.

As for track, Sam still looks (and probably would if you asked him) like he could click off a mighty fast race in the hurdles just like he did when he started to school in Bristow, Okla. then at Oklahoma Baptist University and then at Wayland University.

He broke the state and national high school records while at Bristow in 1962 in the high hurdles, running the state meet in 15 seconds flat and clocking a 14.9 time in the nationals.

In 1935, while at OBU Sam won the National Collegiate title and the next year was the worlds champ. He didn't know at this time but he was studying to be

#### Some Good Ones

"I've seen some great ones run, Jessie Owens, Al Morrow, Spec Towns, Slats Hardin, Ralph Metcalf," the former coach said.

In 1948 while at Wayland Sam was approached by the college president who asked him if he would organize and coach a girls basketball team, pull out all the stops and get the college some publicity.

"I'd always been used to doing things in a big way and always going to the top, so, I asked him how far did we want to go and when he said, as far as you can take them, I was ready," Sam said.

The second year Sam coached the queens they made it to the National tournament and placed second, losing only to the team that won. After that the queens became one of the best-known

girls basketball teams in the nation. Probably one of the greatest thrills in Sams life was eing inducted into the Helms Track and Field Hall of

Fame in 1957. But maybe one he'll remember even more than that is running a close second, at the age of 32 in a hurdles race at the Fort Worth Fat Stock Show in 1945.

He lost to a young man, who was still in college. Not bad for the old folks, hey?
