VERTICAL JET

MUNICH, Germany (UPI) -West Germany's Dornier aircraft works Tuesday unveiled what it hopes will be the world's first vertical takeoff jet transport.

The 10-Jet D031, designed to carry about seven tons of cargo and take off and land vertically or from limited runway space. has not yet been flown but has been thoroughly tested on a stationary stand.

MILITARY STRENGTH WASHINGTON (UPI) -The armed forces recorded an increase of 35,640 men during October, bringing combined strength to 2,759,440.

The Defense Department said Tuesday that the Army and Navy gained more than 14,000 men each, the Marines more than 5,000 and the Air Force more than 1,000. The Army now has 1,016.921, the Navy 704.811. the Marines 203,811 and the Air Force 833,897.



The theft was reported by R. C. Matson today. He told police the thieves were primarily taking sheets of plywood.







United Press International WASHINGTON (UPI) -The Committee for a Sane Christmas Policy met at my house one evening this week to review the situation.

The first item on the agenda was the escalation of Christmas cards. As chairman, I called on the vice chairman for a report.

"All of the cards we ordered with our names printed on them have been addressed and we are still at least 15 short of the number required to meet our present commitments," she

"Can't something be done to stop this buildup?" I asked. "First it was 50. Then 75. Then 100. This year the quota jumped to 150 and now that is being called inadequate."

"Our involvement is a matter of principle," she replied. "As long as friends, neighbors, old college chums, Army buddies and the like keep sending us cards, we have no

choice but to retaliate." Negotiate Sending "Couldn't the exchange be limited by negotiation?"

"In theory, we are willing to negotiate at any time. But it is difficult to initiate negotiations without creating the impression that we are soft on Christmas. "How about a unilateral withdrawel?"

"That almost surely would have far-reaching consequences. According to the 'domino theory,' if we stopped sending Christmas cards we wouldn't get invited to New Year's parties."

"Doesn't this steady enlargement of our Christmas card list produce counter-actions that will only lead to additional increases later?"



Midwest Heads UPI All-American

NEW YORK (UPI) -Michigan State, Arkansas and Nebraska the nation's three top teams, furnished most of the talent today for the 1965 United Press International all-America football teams.

The three ranking college powers placed a total of 12 players on the 44-man all-star squad picked for the UPI by 242 sports writers and broadcasters in a nation-wide ballot.

Because of the return of twoplatoon football for the first time since 1952, the UPI selected offensive and defensive teams. Michigan State and Arkansas each placed two players on the two first teams as did Notre Dame and Ohio State. Nebraska got one berth on the first squads.

On the second teams, Michigan State received Four berths. Nebraska, three and Arkansas, one. That gave Michigan State, the No. 1 team, a total of six places on the two squads; Nebraska, the No. 3 team, four.

Geographically, the Midwest dominated the mythical squad, placing 16 players. The Southwest landed eight berths, the Midlands and the South seven each. The Far West and the East received three places each leaving only the Rockies, of the seven geographical sections of the nation, without a representative on the all-star teams.

Compare With Pros Both the offensive and defensive units are heavy and fast. In weight, they compare favorably with the top professional teams

The offensive line averages 210 pounds and well over six feet in height. Ball is the heaviest at 240 and Hines the

tallest at 6-5. The offensive backfield averages just a fraction under 200 and also over six feet in height. The defensive eleven has an

average of 216 pounds and also is well above six feet. All of the all-America players have brilliant credentials.

Twilley was the leading pass receiver for the second year in a row; Garrett set a new alltime college rushing record; Grabowski broke all of Red Grange's old records at Illinois; Griese had a day all quarterbacks dream of when he completed 19 of 22 passes for 283 yards and three touchdowns as Purdue defeated Notre Dame.

Most of the players on the first squad who were eligible were first choices in the professional football draft, indicating the high caliber of the 1965 college crop.

Many of the players played on both offense and defense. Led by Nobis, many of them received votes for both squads.
