The United States could not find the assembly votes to impose the charter rule on the Soviet Union. So the Johnson administration surrendered. So it is likely to be with Red China. If the Chinese Reds miss this year they are likely to hit next time. As the emerging socalled nations came to the surface in Asia and Africa they were welcomed into U.N. membership, thus diluting the assembly in all respects as a dependable base for American foreign policy.
