

### Gardening News

By THELMA BRAY

The "Lone Star Gardener" for December devoted many pages to new and clever ideas for Christmas decorations for our homes, written by Mrs. Ray

Decorations for several trees are as follows:

PATIO TREE

"The forgotten area at this season! Yet most of us consider our patio an outdoor room. A delightful patio tree is made from a bare branch about 5 feet tall. Secure the branch in plaster of paris in an appropriate container, after spraying it white and dusting with glitter. (You will love this when the sun shines on it.) Decorate with bird's nests, either the real thing or some made of excelsior sprayed gold. Artificial birds complete this simple to make and very effective patio

#### CRANBERRY TREE

"For the kitchen make a cranberry tree. Using a styrofoam triangle, spray it with red paint and, using toothpicks to fasten them on, cover the form closely with cranberries, remembering to spray them with a plastic as a preservative. Tuck in a few sprigs of holly and finish with a green ribbon

SOAP FRUIT TREE

"To get a respite from some of the glitter and gleam, here's a restful note for the dining area; a lovely little tree very suitable for a buffet or server. Using a quick drying white glue, glue a tall styrofoam cone into a footed glass or small compote which you have sprayed gold. Wire small bunches of Princess Pine to toothpicks, dip picks in glue, insert in cone, covering completely. Trim with scissors, if necessary, for a neat shape. Decorate with soap fruit apples or any small artificial

Place a small plastic tree - top ornament which has been sprayed gold at the top of this handsome tree.

MONEY TREE

"This is fine for a coffee table and a timely thought, especially if your family seems to think that money grows on trees at this time of year. Secure a small branch in an inexpensive plastic container, using plaster of paris. Spray both a bright gold and tie on gold foil wrapped chocolate "coins", available at candy counters. Secure the coins to the branch by sewing through them and tying to the branch or wire them on with very find gold wire.

"For the special glamour that spells the spirit of Christmas let your imagination go on a spree! The holidays always provide a wonderful opportunity to express your personality and glorify the season with the festive decorations you make for your home.

"Christmas can be even more exciting, even more beautiful, if you remember that harmony and unity are viatlly important in designing decorations you will love to live with, A unified color scheme will get you off to a good start; an over - all theme makes it even easier to come up with decorations in good taste that will complete the harmony of color and design that you strive for in decorating your home.

"Although any of the decorations described here are adaptable to any color scheme, nothing has ever equaled the evocative impact of red, green and gold to highlight the Christmas scene, and it is the color scheme preferred by most. So working with these colors, and since the center of the decorations is the tree itself, let's decorate with







NEW YORK (UPI) - The merry jingle of cash registers and the ubiquitous caroling of Christmas music in retail stores dominated business news this

Retail trade was up 3 to 7 per cent over a year ago across the country, Dun & Bradstreet reported. A survey published by New York's huge Chase Manhattan Bank said that Christmas business continues each year to account for a larger proportion of total annual retail revenues and that to more and more segments of the food industry, in particular, a booming Christmas season is a lifeand-death matter.

Turkeys, fine hams, candy, glazed fruits, champagne and wines and liquors in general, cranberries, dates, factorybaked fruitcakes, bakery - made mince pies-all these products depend for 40 per cent or more of their total annual sales on Christmas and Thanksgiving, Chase Manhattan study

The Dun & Bradstreet weekly report showed that this year expensive women's dresses are being bought for gifts in larger numbers than usual - in dressy brocades, chiffons and velvets. Lounging robes for both women and men also are near the top in gift sales.

Furs, perfumes and cosmetics are holding their traditional popularity. For men, there has been an extraordinarily large sale of expensive cuff links and tie clasps with jade the most favored stone. Also popular are velour shirts, alpaca sweaters, paisley ties and sueded outer






