## Johnson to Reiterate Our Determination to Fight

WASHINGTON (UPI) -President Johnson goes before Congress and the nation tonight, prepared to express new determination to fight on two fronts-for peace in Southeast Asia and to achieve the domestic goals of his Great

The Chief Executive, grave and at times tense about the Viet Nam war, will deliver his State of the Union message before a joint session of the House and Senate. It will be televised in color across the country

The live message will broadcast at 8 p.m. ~

The nation was anxiously awaiting the report from the President, particularly in view of his campaign to bring the Communists to the conference table in the war.

was designed to stress reality without sounding too grim to the home audience or overly

anxious to the Communists. Moreover, with the peace offensive still in progress, Johnson could speak of it only in generalities?

major surprises would be in the message. Should some important word come from Hanoi during the day, there was little chance it would be reflected in his address. Any such communication would have to be examined with great care

At the same time, Johnson was well aware his remarks before Congress would be given microscopic study in Hanoi, Peking and Moscow, although


