SPACE CENTER, Houston (UPI) --- Gemini 8 astronauts Neil Armstrong and David Scott headed home aboard a success. The 13 artists sold 48 destroyer today to help puzzled scientists learn why their magnificently flying space machine suddenly turned into a potential death trap.
