CHICAGO (UPI) -Three student nurses from the Philippines tried to talk their six American classmates into fighting "for their honor" against the intruder who later slaughtered eight of them, a Philippine official said today. The American girls argued against it.

Miss Amurao, clad in a blue summer frock, was taken to the Bridwell Jail Hospital Monday for a face-to-face confrontation with Speck, whose photograph she has already identified as that of the murderer.

But Speck was considered too ill to see her. He has been strapped in his hospital bed since he was found in a skid row flophouse early Sunday morning with his wrist gashed by a broken wine bottle.

Dr. William Norcross, the

physician attending Speck, said the young man had suffered and considerable loss of blood. Plain clothes police officers remain in the hospital room with Speck at all times, and heavily armed police patrol the. grounds to prevent any attempt on Speck's life.

The suspect's condition also prevented a planned court appearance Monday for arraignment, and doctors said it may be several days before Speck is well enough to go to court or face Miss Amurao.

Funeral services were held Monday for five of the eight student nurses murdered in their Chicago apartment last week. It was the Feast Day of St. Camillus, patron saint of nursing.

A funeral mass for the two Filipino exchnge students will be held today at Our Lady of Heaven Roman Catholic Church, with Archbishop John P. Cody expected to deliver a eulogy. 2 The bodies of the two

exchange students will be flown to the Philippines later today.

Among those buried Monday were Jary Ann Jordan, 20; Patricia Matusek, 20; Suzanne Farris, 21; Nine J. Schmale, 21: and Pameia Wilkening, 20, Gloria Jean Davy, the eighth victim, was buried Saturday.





Simple automout would reveal that the one-manone-vote rule proclaimed the current method of choosing the Eelctoral College to be in absolute violation of the U.S. Constitution. That proclamation was only by implication, however, requircs formal atfirmation.

It can be assumed that the court did not intend the oneman-one-vote rule to undercut the Electoral College. It can be assumed that the left wing pressure groups of LBJ's Great Society likewise were not aware of the meaning of the court's anew rule.
