Wedding Church for Luci, Pat Belongs to All American Catholics

WASHINGTON (UPI) -Luci Johnson will be married in a massive \$30 million church which enjoys a unique status in U. S. Catholicism.

The National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, where the President's daughter will exchange vows Saturday with Patrick Nugent, is the only church which belongs to all American Catholics rather than to any particular diocese. With a floor area of 77,500

square feet, the Shrine is the second largest church in America and the seventh largest in the world. In this country, it is surpassed only by the Episcopa; Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York, which encompasses an area of 121,000 square feet.

Theotherfivelarger churches are all in Europe. They are St. Peter's in Romewhich is by far the world's biggest house of worship, with

an area of 227,000 square feet-.... a huge tiled dome and flanked and the cathedrals of Seville,

Milan, Liverpool and Cologne. Like most of the world's great churches, the Shrine has been a long time under construction. Its foundation stone was laid in 1920. The exterior was completed by 1959 but there is still much work to be done finishing and embellishing the interior.

It is Romanesque-Byzantine in architecture, surmounted by by a tall capanile or bell-tower. Like medieval cathedrals, it was built entirely of masonry, without a steel skeleton or framework. More than 11 million bricks and more than 10,000 cubic yards of concrete went into its construction. Dimensions of the Shrine are impressive, whether gauged by the naked eye or expressed in statistics. It is 459 fet long. half again as long as a football

The dome rises to 237 feet, about 50 feet higher than the leaning tower of Pisa, and Its bell tower, which houses a 56bell carillon, scrapes the sky at 329 feet. (The famous Campanile of St. Mark's Church in Venice is 325 feet high).

The Shrine will have no difficulty accommodating the 700 guests invited to the Johnson-Nugent wedding. It has a normal seating capacity of

#### 3,000 and in a pinch can handle up to 5,000 persons.

Luci will be the first bride married at the marble-canopied altar of the main sanctuary. Previous weddings at the Shrine have been held in its subterranean crypt church or in one of its 35 chapels.

As a national church, the Shrine is governed by a board representing the entire U.S. Catholic hierarchy. It was intended to be, and

has become a pilgrimmage for Catholics from every part of the nation. Last year, more than 1 million visitors passed through its doors, which are open to the public from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., seven days a week.

The tide of tourists doubtless will grow even larger after the Shrine adds to its spiritual and architectural attractions the distinction of being "the church where Luci was married."



## Strains on Family Lead to Accidents

BOSTON, Mass. - Accidents make up the foremost pediatric disease in the country, taking more children's lives each year than the next three chief childkillers combined-cancer, birth defects, and pneumonia.

In an effort to reduce the appalling accident toll, a team of physicians, psychologists, and social workers at the Children's Hospital Medical Center here made a detailed study of preechool children admitted for treatment of accidental injury. They found that accidents do not 'just happen.' They are triggered by stress and by fatigue. Most accidents to children, they found, occur between three and six o'clock - when mothers are rushing to meet the demands of children home from school, preparing dinner, getting baby ready for his bath, tidying up.

Suggestions for avoiding accidents, as well as clear, simple instructions on what to do should accidents occur, are now 'available in an attractive, pursesized booklet. "Accident Handbook"". Compiled by the staff of the medical center, and published by Dell, the booklet can be bought for 25 cents.
