By RAY CROMLEY Washington Correspondent WASHINGTON (NEA) -According to stories circulating in the Far East, the United States may have taken the first step in achieving a diplomatic cosp in Southern Asia. If successful:

-Pakistan would be weaned away from its growing attachment to Communist China.




