



The education explosion clogging classrooms from grade to graduate schools across the nation is also making itself felt at the preschool level. Enrollment figures, in terms of both total numbers and age-group percentages, are edging up in kindergartens and nursery schools. Of the more than 12.5 million children aged 3 to 5, some 3.4 million or 27.1 per cent were enrolled in public or private courses at the start of the school year last October compared with a 25.5 per cent enrollment for this age group the previous year, Health, Education and Welfare Department figures show. Enrollment ratios climb rapidly with age, from a low of less than 5 per cent of three-year-olds in nursery school to a kindergarten peak of some 60 per cent of all five-year-olds.
