

However, the court's ruling was based not on Good Samaritanism but on the special relationship between the two parties. They were not merely two strangers. They were carrierand-passenger. When there is such a relationship, and an emergency arises en route, the law generally does impose an

affirmative duty to give aid. That doesn't mean the passenger can hold the carrier liable under all circumstances. For one thing, before there is any duty to help, there must be some clear sign that help is

Thus, a railroad was excused for not aiding a seriously ill woman, when the only sign of her aifliction was that she had rested her head on her hand. But once the peril is apparent, then the carrier's duty be-

How speedily must help be given? That depends on the particular situation. For example: In a medical emergency involving an expectant mother on a train, a court held that the train should have been halted at the next town, rather than the next regular stop.

And how long does the car rier's duty last? Possibly even beyond arrival at the passenger's destination.

In one case, a bus rider who had suffered a severe eye injury was left in the station. and helpless. The bus company was later held liable for not making sure the victim was placed in responsible

Summarizing the law, the court said: "The carrier owes to the passenger the consideration and care of common humanity.'

Surfers have developed their own language, their own music, their own customs and mores Because the sport attracted some of the idle teen-agers, it got a bad name. It was associated in most minds with juvenile delinquency.

time; they lead to a deferment, Most of today's surfers own their boards, an indication of their seriousness of purpose. The average board - 9'8" of plastic-coated wood - costs \$140. But many cost more because of their larger size or special decorations. NIGHT BLINDERS



The person with 20/40 daytime vision may have only 20, 100 vision at night, according to authorities. Driving at night, guided only by car headlights, such a person suffers much the same effect as if wearing dark glasses and blinders-a lethal ombination.

Ability to see straight ahead is limited to range of the head-lights, about 350 feet maximum. Since headlights shine only to the front, lateral vision is vir-tually zero. The driver is in a "tunnel of vision," seeing only the road immediately ahead. With the nighttime traffic death rate two and a half times the daytime rate, the Street and Highway Safety Lighting Bureau urges better street lighting as a means of overcoming this problem and mak-

Fur To Fly As GOP Bids In Georgia

Washington Correspondent ATLANTA (NEA) -Georgia's first Republican governor nominee since 1874, Rep. Howard (Bo) Callaway, is a strong front-runner today, but if former governor Ellis Arnall can win an expected Democratic runoff victory Sept. 28 he may turn this race into a close and extremely bitter battle.
